1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans and Family3 Information Act".

4 SEC. 2. FACT SHEETS.

5 (a) LANGUAGES.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
6 shall make available versions of all fact sheets of the De7 partment of Veterans Affairs in—

8 (1) English;

9 (2) Spanish;

10 (3) Tagalog; and

(4) each of the 10 most commonly spoken languages, other than English, in the United States
that are not otherwise covered by paragraphs (2)
and (3).

15 (b) WEBSITE.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs 16 shall establish and maintain a publicly available website of the Department of Veterans Affairs that contains links 17 to all fact sheets of the Veterans Benefits Administration, 18 19 Veterans Health Administration, and of the National 20 Cemetery Administration. The website shall be accessible by a clearly labeled hyperlink on the homepage of the De-21 22 partment.

23 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
24 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans
25 Affairs shall submit a report to Congress regarding fact
26 sheets described in subsection (a) and details of the Lan•HR 2093 EH

guage Access Plan of the Department of Veteran Affairs.
 The report shall include the following:

3 (1) What the Secretary determines constitutes
4 a fact sheet of the Department for purposes of this
5 Act.

6 (2) How such fact sheets are utilized and dis7 tributed other than on and through the website of
8 the Department.

9 (3) How such Language Access Plan is commu10 nicated to veterans, family members of veterans, and
11 caregivers.

(4) The roles and responsibilities of patient advocates in the coordination of care for veterans with
limited English proficiency, family members of such
veterans, and caregivers.

16 (5) Other demographic information that the
17 Secretary determines appropriate regarding veterans
18 with limited English proficiency.
