A BILL

To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to expand support for police officer family services, stress reduction, and suicide prevention, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Supporting and Treat-
5 ing Officers In Crisis Act of 2019”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXPANDING SUPPORT FOR POLICE OFFICER FAM-**
7 **ILY SERVICES, STRESS REDUCTION, AND SUI-**
8 **CIDE PREVENTION.**

9 Part W of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and
10 Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10491 et seq.) is
11 amended—

12 (1) in the part heading, by striking “**FAMILY**
13 **SUPPORT**” and inserting “**SUPPORT FOR LAW**
14 **ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND FAMILIES**”;

15 (2) in section 2301 (34 U.S.C. 10491)—

16 (A) in paragraph (2), by inserting “, in-
17 cluding any research and reports developed
18 under the Law Enforcement Mental Health and
19 Wellness Act of 2017 (Public Law 115–113;
20 131 Stat. 2276)” after “interested parties”;
21 and

22 (B) in paragraph (4), by inserting “, psy-
23 chological services, suicide prevention,” after
24 “stress reduction”;

1 (3) in section 2302 (34 U.S.C. 10492), by in-
2 serting “and mental health services” after “family
3 support services”; and

4 (4) in section 2303 (34 U.S.C. 10493)—

5 (A) in subsection (b)—

6 (i) in paragraph (1), by inserting “of-
7 ficers and” after “law enforcement”; and

8 (ii) by amending paragraph (4) to
9 read as follows:

10 “(4) Evidence-based programs to reduce stress,
11 prevent suicide, and promote mental health.”; and

12 (B) in subsection (c)—

13 (i) in paragraph (5), by inserting “,
14 mental health crisis, and suicide preven-
15 tion” after “family crisis”;

16 (ii) in paragraph (6), by striking
17 “human immunodeficiency virus” and in-
18 serting “infectious disease”;

19 (iii) in paragraph (8), by inserting “,
20 injured, or permanently disabled” after
21 “killed”; and

22 (iv) by striking paragraph (10) and
23 inserting the following:

1 “(10) Specialized training for identifying, re-
2 porting, and responding to officer mental health cri-
3 ses and suicide.

4 “(11) Technical assistance and training to sup-
5 port any or all of the services described in para-
6 graphs (1) through (10).”.

7 **SEC. 3. REAUTHORIZING GRANT PROGRAMS FOR SUP-**
8 **PORTING LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND**
9 **FAMILIES.**

10 Section 1001(a)(21) of title I of the Omnibus Crime
11 Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C.
12 10261(a)(21)) is amended to read as follows:

13 “(21) There are authorized to be appropriated to
14 carry out part W, \$7,500,000 for each of fiscal years 2020
15 through 2024.”.

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
