Mr. GARRETT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Homeland Security

A BILL

To prohibit the Transportation Security Administration from performing security screening operations for surface transportation, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Freedom of Travel Act
5 of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON AUTHORITIES OF THE TRANSPOR-**
7 **TATION SECURITY ADMINISTRATION.**

8 (a) PROHIBITION.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
9 sion of law, the Transportation Security Administration

1 may not perform security screening operations other than
2 pursuant to sections 44901 and 44935 of title 49, United
3 States Code.

4 (b) NULLIFICATION OF OTHER FEDERAL LAWS.—
5 Any Act authorizing the Transportation Security Adminis-
6 tration to perform security screening operations not de-
7 scribed in subsection (a) shall have no force or effect.

8 (c) VIPR TEAMS.—Section 1303 of Implementing
9 Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 (6
10 U.S.C. 1112; Public Law 110–53), and the item relating
11 to such section in the table of contents in section 1(b) of
12 such Act, are repealed.
