Mr. HASTINGS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require reimbursement from certain public officials whose travel results in unusual costs relating to protection of those officials, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Taxpayers Require Ur-
5 gent Mandatory Protection from Egregious Debt Act of
6 2017” or as the “TRUMPED Act of 2017”.

7 **SEC. 2. REIMBURSEMENT REQUIRED.**

8 In the case of any person who the United States Se-
9 cret Service is authorized to protect under paragraph (1)

1 or (2) of section 3056(a) of title 18, United States Code,
2 if that person travels to any real property in which that
3 person or the spouse of that person has any ownership
4 interest (including any licensing agreement) for any period
5 of time longer than 24 hours—

6 (1) each State or unit of local government
7 wherein the real property is located may recover, in
8 a civil action against the person accorded such pro-
9 tection, any costs incurred by such State or unit of
10 local government in connection with the provision of
11 such protection; and

12 (2) if any business that is near that property is
13 significantly adversely affected by the provision of
14 such protection, that business may bring an action
15 for appropriate relief against the person accorded
16 such protection.

17 **SEC. 3. REPORT.**

18 Not later than 90 days after the enactment of this
19 Act, the U.S. Secret Service shall submit a report to the
20 Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Rep-
21 resentatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
22 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate detailing the costs
23 of protecting those granted protection under paragraph
24 (1) or (2) of section 3056(a) of title 18, United States
25 Code, since January 20, 2017, for visits to real property

1 lasting longer than 24 hours in which they or a spouse
2 have an ownership interest.

3 **SEC. 4. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.**

4 The sovereign immunity of the United States is here-
5 by waived to the extent required to enable recovery in an
6 action under section 2.

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
