## A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to use a time requirement for determining eligibility for the reimbursement of certain travel expenses.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. REIMBURSEMENT OF CERTAIN TRAVEL EX-**  
4       **PENSES.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1074i of title 10, United  
6 States Code, is amended—

7           (1) in subsection (a), by striking “more than  
8       100 miles” and inserting “at a location that is more  
9       than 90 minutes driving time, as determined under  
10       subsection (c),”;

1           (2) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-  
2           section (d); and

3           (3) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-  
4           lowing new subsection (c):

5           “(c) DRIVING TIME.—For purposes of this sub-  
6           section, the Secretary shall prescribe regulations that—

7           “(1) define driving time;

8           “(2) specify the method that will be used to cal-  
9           culate driving time through the use of an Internet-  
10          based global tracking system that determines time  
11          and distance; and

12          “(3) ensure that time spent in traffic conges-  
13          tion will not be considered in the calculation of driv-  
14          ing time.”.

15          (b) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 180 days after  
16          the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of  
17          Defense shall prescribe the regulations required by sub-  
18          section (c) of section 1074i of title 10, United States Code,  
19          as added by this Act.
