as the Pullman National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

Ms. KELLY of Illinois (for herself, Mr. DANNY K. DAVIS of Illinois, Mr. QUIGLEY, Mr. CASTEN, Mrs. BUSTOS, Mr. RUSH, and Ms. NEWMAN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To redesignate the Pullman National Monument in the State of Illinois as the Pullman National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Pullman National His-
5 torical Park Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act:

8 (1) HISTORICAL PARK.—The term “historical
9 park” means the Pullman National Historical Park.

1 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
2 the Secretary of the Interior.

3 **SEC. 3. REDESIGNATION OF PULLMAN NATIONAL MONU-**
4 **MENT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Pullman National Monu-
6 ment, established by Proclamation Number 9233, dated
7 February 19, 2015, is redesignated as the “Pullman Na-
8 tional Historical Park.”.

9 (b) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—Any funds available
10 for purposes of the Pullman National Monument shall be
11 available for purposes of the historical park.

12 (c) REFERENCES.—Any references in a law, regula-
13 tion, document, record, map, or other paper of the United
14 States to the Pullman National Monument shall be consid-
15 ered to be a reference to the historical park.

16 **SEC. 4. PURPOSES.**

17 The purposes of the historical park are to preserve,
18 protect, and interpret Pullman’s nationally significant cul-
19 tural and historical resources associated with—

20 (1) the Nation’s labor history and creation of a
21 national Labor Day holiday;

22 (2) the first planned industrial community in
23 the United States;

24 (3) the architecture and landscape design of the
25 planned community;

1 (4) the pivotal role of the Pullman porter in the
2 rise of the African-American middle class; and
3 (5) the entirety of history, culture, and historic
4 figures embodied in Presidential Proclamation Num-
5 ber 9233.

6 **SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION.**

7 The Secretary shall administer the land within the
8 boundary of the historical park in accordance with—

9 (1) this Act; and
10 (2) the laws generally applicable to units of the
11 National Park System, including—

12 (A) section 100101(a), chapter 1003, and
13 sections 100751(a), 100752, 100753 and
14 102101 of title 54, United States Code; and
15 (B) chapter 3201 of title 54, United States
16 Code.

17 **SEC. 6. COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.**

18 To further the purposes of this subsection and not-
19 withstanding chapter 63 of title 31, United States Code,
20 the Secretary may enter into cooperative agreements with
21 the State, other public and non-profit entities, and other
22 interested parties—

23 (1) to support collaborative interpretive and
24 educational programs at non-Federal historic prop-

1 erties within the boundaries of the historical park;
2 and

3 (2) to identify, interpret, and provide assistance
4 for the preservation of non-Federal land within the
5 boundaries of the historical park and at sites in
6 close proximity to the historical park, but located
7 outside the boundaries of the historical park, includ-
8 ing providing for placement of directional and inter-
9 pretive signage, exhibits, and technology-based inter-
10 pretive devices; and

11 **SEC. 7. USE OF FUNDS.**

12 The Secretary may use appropriated funds to mark,
13 interpret, improve, restore, and provide technical assist-
14 ance with respect to the preservation and interpretation
15 of the properties. Any payment made by the Secretary
16 under this clause shall be subject to an agreement that
17 the conversion, use, or disposal of the project for purposes
18 that are inconsistent with the purposes of this subsection,
19 as determined by the Secretary, shall result in a right of
20 the United States to reimbursement of the greater of—

21 (1) the amount provided by the Secretary to the
22 project; or

23 (2) an amount equal to the increase in the
24 value of the project that is attributable to the funds,
25 as determined by the Secretary at the time of the

1 conversion, use, or disposal. Any cooperative agree-
2 ment entered into under this subparagraph shall
3 provide for reasonable public access to the resources
4 covered by the cooperative agreement.

5 SEC. 8. ACQUISITION OF LAND.

6 The Secretary may acquire for inclusion in the histor-
7 ical park any land (including interests in land), buildings,
8 or structures owned by the State, or any other political,
9 private, or nonprofit entity by donation, transfer, ex-
10 change, or purchase from a willing seller.

11 SEC. 9. MANAGEMENT PLAN.

12 Not later than 3 fiscal years after the date on which
13 funds are first made available to carry out this Act, the
14 Secretary shall complete a general management plan for
15 the historical park.
