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## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Defense to seek to engage the Government of Taiwan regarding expanded cooperation with respect to military cybersecurity activities, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Taiwan Cybersecurity  
5 Resiliency Act of 2023”.

1   **SEC. 2. MILITARY CYBERSECURITY COOPERATION WITH**  
2                   **TAIWAN.**

3         (a) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180 days after  
4   the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of  
5   Defense, acting through the Under Secretary of Defense  
6   for Policy, in concurrence with the Secretary of State and  
7   in coordination with the Commander of the United States  
8   Cyber Command and the Commander of the United States  
9   Indo-Pacific Command, shall seek to engage the Govern-  
10  ment of Taiwan for the purpose of expanding cooperation  
11   on military cybersecurity activities.

12         (b) COOPERATION EFFORTS.—In expanding the co-  
13   operation of military cybersecurity activities between the  
14   Department of Defense and the Government of Taiwan  
15   under subsection (a), the Secretary of Defense may carry  
16   out efforts to—

17                 (1) actively defend military networks, infra-  
18   structure, and systems;

19                 (2) eradicate malicious cyber activity that has  
20   compromised such networks, infrastructure, and sys-  
21   tems;

22                 (3) leverage United States commercial and mili-  
23   tary cybersecurity technology and services to harden  
24   and defend such networks, infrastructure, and sys-  
25   tems; and

1                             (4) conduct combined cybersecurity training ac-  
2                             tivities and exercises.

3                             (c) BRIEFINGS.—

4                             (1) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180 days  
5                             after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-  
6                             retary of Defense, in coordination with the Secretary  
7                             of State, shall provide to the appropriate congres-  
8                             sional committees a briefing on the implementation  
9                             of this section.

10                            (2) CONTENTS.—The briefing under paragraph  
11                            (1) shall include the following:

12                            (A) A description of the feasibility and ad-  
13                             visability of expanding cooperation on military  
14                             cybersecurity activities between the Department  
15                             of Defense and the Government of Taiwan.

16                            (B) An identification of any challenges and  
17                             resources necessary to be addressed so as to ex-  
18                             pand such cooperation.

19                            (C) An overview of efforts undertaken pur-  
20                             suant to this section.

21                            (D) Any other matters the Secretary deter-  
22                             mines relevant.

23                            (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES  
24                             DEFINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate con-  
25                             gressional committees” means—

- 1                   (1) the Committee on Armed Services and the  
2                   Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-  
3                   resentatives; and  
4                   (2) the Committee on Armed Services and the  
5                   Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate.

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
