A BILL

To repeal the requirements under the Natural Gas Act for obtaining authorization for the exportation or importation of natural gas, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Expedite Our Economy
5 Act of 2013”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXPORTATION OR IMPORTATION OF NATURAL GAS.**

2 (a) REPEAL.—Subsections (a) through (c) of section
3 3 of the Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C. 717b) are repealed.

4 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 3 of the
5 Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C. 717b) is amended in the sec-
6 tion heading by striking “**EXPORTATION OR IMPORTA-**
7 **TION OF NATURAL GAS;**”.

8 **SEC. 3. REPORT ON GLOBAL EXPORTS OF NATURAL GAS**
9 **PRODUCTION.**

10 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
11 ment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to
12 Congress a report on the following:

13 (1) The economic policies of foreign countries
14 with natural gas resources and reserves as such poli-
15 cies relate to the development and production of
16 their natural gas resources and reserves and the ex-
17 tent and status of their natural gas resources and
18 reserves.

19 (2) The potential to export the natural gas pro-
20 duction of such foreign countries to the global mar-
21 ket and the impact of the export of such natural gas
22 production on the global market.

23 (3) A description of actions taken by the United
24 States Government to foster natural gas exports to

- 1 foreign countries that may have an interest in im-
- 2 porting natural gas from the United States.
