To authorize and request the President to award the Medal of Honor posthumously to Private First Class William P. Fesken of the United States Army for acts of valor during the Vietnam War.

3 SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION AND REQUEST FOR AWARD
4 OF MEDAL OF HONOR TO WILLIAM P. FESKEN
5 FOR ACTS OF VALOR DURING THE VIETNAM
6 WAR.

7 (a) AUTHORIZATION.—Notwithstanding the time lim-8 itations specified in section 3744 of title 10, United States

Code, or any other time limitation with respect to the
 awarding of certain medals to persons who served in the
 Armed Forces, the President is authorized and requested
 to award the Medal of Honor posthumously under section
 3741 of such title to former Private First Class William
 P. Fesken of the United States Army for the acts of valor
 during the Vietnam War described in subsection (b).

8 (b) ACTS OF VALOR DESCRIBED.—The acts of valor 9 referred to in subsection (a) are the actions of then Private First Class William P. Fesken who, while serving 10 with Company A, 3d Battalion, 47th Infantry, 9th Infan-11 12 try Division, distinguished himself conspicuously by gal-13 lantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty on May 2, 1967, while protecting 14 15 wounded members of his squad during repeated attacks 16 by a Viet Cong force until his death on that date.
