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## A BILL

Making supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2015 for the TIGER discretionary grant program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Transportation Invest-  
5 ment Generating Economic Recovery for Cities Under-  
6 funded Because of Size Act of 2015” or the “TIGER  
7 CUBS Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION FOR TIGER**  
2 **GRANTS.**

3 The following sums are appropriated, out of any  
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for fis-  
5 cal year 2015:

6 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION  
7 OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY  
8 NATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENTS

9 For an additional amount for “National Infrastruc-  
10 ture Investments” in accordance with the provisions under  
11 this heading in title I of division K of Public Law 113–  
12 235, \$500,000,000: *Provided*, That the amount under this  
13 heading shall remain available until September 30, 2017:  
14 *Provided further*, That not less than \$100,000,000 of the  
15 funds provided under this heading shall be for projects lo-  
16 cated in cities with populations between 10,000 and  
17 50,000: *Provided further*, That for a project described in  
18 the preceding proviso, the minimum grant amount shall  
19 be \$2,000,000, and the Secretary of Transportation may  
20 provide a Federal share of costs in excess of 80 percent:  
21 *Provided further*, That the amount under this heading is  
22 designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement  
23 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget  
24 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, except that  
25 such amount shall be available only if the President subse-

- 1 quently so designates such amount and transmits such
- 2 designation to the Congress.

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
