## AN ACT

To amend the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 to reauthorize the Missing Alzheimer's Disease Patient Alert Program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Missing Alzheimer's
- 3 Disease Patient Alert Program Reauthorization Act of
- 4 2012".
- 5 SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF THE MISSING ALZHEIMER'S
- 6 DISEASE PATIENT ALERT PROGRAM.
- 7 Section 240001 of the Violent Crime Control and
- 8 Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (42 U.S.C. 14181) is
- 9 amended—
- 10 (1) by amending subsection (a) to read as fol-
- 11 lows:
- 12 "(a) Grant.—Subject to the availability of appro-
- 13 priations to carry out this section, the Attorney General,
- 14 through the Bureau of Justice Assistance, shall award
- 15 competitive grants to nonprofit organizations to assist
- 16 such organizations in paying for the costs of planning, de-
- 17 signing, establishing, and operating locally based,
- 18 proactive programs to protect and locate missing patients
- 19 with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.";
- 20 (2) in subsection (b), by inserting "competitive"
- 21 after "to receive a";
- 22 (3) by amending subsection (c) to read as fol-
- lows:
- "(c) Preference.—In awarding grants under sub-
- 25 section (a), the Attorney General shall give preference to
- 26 national nonprofit organizations that have experience

- 1 working with patients, and families of patients, with Alz-
- 2 heimer's disease and related dementias."; and
- 3 (4) by amending subsection (d) to read as fol-
- 4 lows:
- 5 "(d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 6 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
- 7 + 1,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2013 through
- 8 2017.".
