AN ACT

To reauthorize and enhance Johanna's Law to increase public awareness and knowledge with respect to gynecologic cancers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. REAUTHORIZATION AND ENHANCEMENT OF
 JOHANNA'S LAW.
 (a) IN GENERAL. Section 317P(d) of the Public
 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 247b-17(d)(4)) is amend ed—

(1) in paragraph (4), by inserting after "2009"
 the following: "and \$18,000,000 for the period of
 fiscal years 2012 through 2014"; and

4 (2) by redesignating paragraph (4) as para-5 graph (6).

6 (b) CONSULTATION WITH NONPROFIT GYNECOLOGIC
7 CANCER ORGANIZATIONS.—Section 317P(d) of such Act
8 (42 U.S.C. 247b-17(d)), as amended by subsection (a),
9 is further amended by inserting after paragraph (3) the
10 following:

''(4) 11 CONSULTATION WITH NONPROFIT 12 **GYNECOLOGIC** CANCER ORGANIZATIONS.—In carrying out the national campaign under this sub-13 14 section, the Secretary shall consult with the leading 15 nonprofit gynecologic cancer organizations, with a 16 mission both to conquer ovarian or other gynecologic 17 eancer nationwide and to provide outreach to State 18 and local governments and communities, for the pur-19 pose of determining the best practices for providing 20 gynecologic cancer information and outreach services 21 to varied populations.".

1 SEC. 2. DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS REGARDING OUT 2 REACH AND EDUCATION STRATEGIES RELAT 3 ING TO GYNECOLOGIC CANCER.

4 (a) IN GENERAL. Section 317P(d) of the Public
5 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 247b-17(d)), as amended
6 by section 1, is further amended by inserting after para7 graph (4) the following:

8 "(5) DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS REGARDING
9 OUTREACH AND EDUCATION STRATEGIES.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may 10 11 carry out a program to award grants or con-12 tracts to public or nonprofit private entities for 13 the purpose of earrying out demonstration 14 projects to test and compare different evidence-15 based outreach and education strategies to in-16 crease the awareness and knowledge of women 17 and health care providers with respect to 18 gynecologic cancers, including early warning 19 signs, risk factors, prevention, screening, and 20 treatment options. Such strategies shall include 21 efforts directed at women and their families, 22 physicians, nurses, and key health professionals.

23 "(B) PREFERENCES IN AWARDING GRANTS
 24 OR CONTRACTS.—In making awards under sub 25 paragraph (A), the Secretary shall give pref 26 erence to—

1 "(i) applicants with demonstrated ex-2 pertise in gynecologic cancer education or 3 treatment or in working with groups of 4 women who are at increased risk of 5 gynecologic cancers; and 6 "(ii) applicants that, in the dem-7 onstration project funded by the grant or 8 contract, will establish linkages between 9 physicians, nurses, and key health professionals, health profession students, hos-10 11 pitals, payers, and State health depart-12 ments. 13 "(C) APPLICATION.—To seek a grant or 14 contract under subparagraph (A), an entity 15 shall submit an application to the Secretary in 16 such form, in such manner, and containing such 17 agreements, assurances, and information as the 18 Secretary determines to be necessary to carry 19 out this paragraph. 20 "(D) CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS .- In mak-21 ing awards under subparagraph (A), the See-22 retary shall—

23 <u>"(i) make awards, as practicable, to</u>
24 not fewer than five applicants; and

2	through demonstration projects under this

5	"(E) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later
6	than 12 months after the date of the enactment
7	of this paragraph, and annually thereafter, the
8	Secretary shall submit to the Congress a report
9	that—
10	"(i) summarizes the activities of dem-
11	onstration projects under subparagraph
12	$(\Lambda);$
13	"(ii) evaluates the extent to which the
14	projects were effective in increasing early
15	detection of gynecologic cancers and
16	awareness and knowledge of risk factors
17	and early warning signs in the populations
18	to which the projects were directed; and
19	"(iii) identifies barriers to early detee-
20	tion and appropriate treatment of such
21	cancers.".
22	(b) Conforming Amendment.—Section
23	317P(d)(3)(A) of the Public Health Service Act (42)
24	U.S.C. $247b-17(d)(3)(A)$) is amended by inserting
25	"(other than paragraph (5))" after "this section".
