- To authorize a land exchange involving the acquisition of private land adjacent to the Cibola National Wildlife Refuge in Arizona for inclusion in the refuge in exchange for certain Bureau of Land Management lands in Riverside County, California, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

3	(1) Map 1.—The term "Map 1" means the map				
4	entitled "Specified Parcel of Public Land in Cali				
5	fornia" and dated July 18, 2014.				
6	(2) Map 2.—The term "Map 2" means the map				
7	entitled "River Bottom Farm Lands" and dated				
8	July 18, 2014.				
9	SEC. 2. LAND EXCHANGE, CIBOLA NATIONAL WILDLIFE				
10	REFUGE, ARIZONA, AND BUREAU OF LAND				
11	MANAGEMENT LAND IN RIVERSIDE COUNTY				
12	CALIFORNIA.				
13	(a) Conveyance of Bureau of Land Manage-				
14	MENT LAND.—In exchange for the land described in sub-				
15	section (b), the Secretary of the Interior shall convey to				
16	River Bottom Farms of La Paz County, Arizona, all right				
17	title and interest of the United States in and to certain				
18	Federal land administered by the Secretary through the				
19	Bureau of Land Management consisting of a total of ap-				
20	proximately 80 acres in Riverside County, California, iden-				
21	tified as "Parcel A" on Map 1. The conveyed land shall				
22	be subject to valid existing rights, including easements,				
23	rights-of-way, utility lines, and any other valid encum-				
24	brances on the land as of the date of the conveyance under				
25	this section.				

- 1 (b) Consideration.—As consideration for the con-
- 2 veyance of the Federal land under subsection (a), River
- 3 Bottom Farms shall convey to the United States all right,
- 4 title, and interest of River Bottom Farms in and to two
- 5 parcels of land contiguous to the Cibola National Wildlife
- 6 Refuge in La Paz County, Arizona, consisting of a total
- 7 of approximately 40 acres in La Paz County, Arizona,
- 8 identified as "Parcel 301–05–005B–9" and "Parcel 301–
- 9 05–008–0" on Map 2.
- 10 (c) Equal Value Exchange.—The values of the
- 11 Federal land and non-Federal land to be exchanged under
- 12 this section shall be equal or equalized by the payment
- 13 of cash to the Secretary by River Bottom Farms, if appro-
- 14 priate, pursuant to section 206(b) of the Federal Land
- 15 Policy Management Act (43 U.S.C. 1716(b)). The value
- 16 of the land shall be determined by the Secretary through
- 17 an appraisal performed by a qualified appraiser mutually
- 18 agreed to by the Secretary and River Bottom Farms and
- 19 performed in conformance with the Uniform Appraisal
- 20 Standards for Federal Land Acquisitions (U.S. Depart-
- 21 ment of Justice, December 2000). If the final appraised
- 22 value of the non-Federal land ("Parcel 301–05–005B–9"
- 23 and "Parcel 301–05–008–0" on Map 2) exceeds the value
- 24 of the Federal land ("Parcel A" on Map 1), the surplus

- 1 value of the non-Federal land shall be considered to be
- 2 a donation by River Bottom Farms to the United States.
- 3 (d) Exchange Timetable.—The Secretary shall
- 4 complete the land exchange under this section not later
- 5 than 1 year after the date of the expiration of any existing
- 6 Bureau of Land Management lease agreement or agree-
- 7 ments affecting the Federal land ("Parcel A" on Map 1)
- 8 to be exchanged under this section, unless the Secretary
- 9 and River Bottom Farms mutually agree to extend such
- 10 deadline.
- 11 (e) Administration of Acquired Land.—The
- 12 land acquired by the Secretary under subsection (b) shall
- 13 become part of the Cibola National Wildlife Refuge and
- 14 be administered in accordance with the laws and regula-
- 15 tions generally applicable to the National Wildlife Refuge
- 16 System.
