A BILL

To require the Office of Personnel Management to provide complimentary, comprehensive identity protection coverage to all individuals whose personally identifiable information was compromised during recent data breaches at Federal agencies.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Reducing the Effects
5 of the Cyberattack on OPM Victims Emergency Response
6 Act of 2015” or the “RECOVER Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. IDENTITY PROTECTION COVERAGE FOR INDIVID-**
2 **UALS AFFECTED BY FEDERAL AGENCY DATA**
3 **BREACHES.**

4 (a) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term “affected
5 individual” means any individual whose personally identi-
6 fiable information was compromised during—

7 (1) the data breach of personnel records of cur-
8 rent and former Federal employees, at a network
9 maintained by the Department of the Interior, that
10 was announced by the Office of Personnel Manage-
11 ment on June 4, 2015; or

12 (2) the data breach of systems of the Office of
13 Personnel Management containing information re-
14 lated to the background investigations of current,
15 former, and prospective Federal employees, and of
16 other individuals.

17 (b) IDENTITY PROTECTION COVERAGE.—The Office
18 of Personnel Management shall provide to each affected
19 individual complimentary identity protection coverage
20 that—

21 (1) is not less comprehensive than the com-
22 plimentary identity protection coverage that the Of-
23 fice provided to affected individuals before the date
24 of enactment of this Act;

25 (2) is effective for the remainder of the life of
26 the individual; and

1 (3) includes not less than \$5,000,000 in iden-
2 tity theft insurance.

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
