AN ACT

- To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to issue guidance on electronic consent forms, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Creating Advanced
- 3 Streamlined Electronic Services for Constituents Act of
- 4 2018" or the "CASES Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.
- 6 It is the sense of Congress that—
- 7 (1) congressional offices provide crucial services
- 8 to constituents by acting as a liaison between the
- 9 constituents and the respective agencies;
- 10 (2) this includes assisting constituents by mak-
- ing inquiries and working toward resolutions on be-
- half of the constituent with the respective agencies;
- 13 and
- 14 (3) this process should be simplified through
- 15 the creation of electronic forms that may be sub-
- mitted under section 552a of title 5, United States
- 17 Code (commonly referred to as the Privacy Act),
- thus modernizing the process for constituents and
- improving access and efficiency of Government serv-
- 20 ices and agencies in order to expedite the resolution
- of the problem for which constituents sought help.
- 22 SEC. 3. OMB GUIDANCE ON ELECTRONIC CONSENT FORMS.
- (a) GUIDANCE.—Not later than 1 year after the date
- 24 of the enactment of this Act, the Director shall issue guid-
- 25 ance that does the following:
- 26 (1) Establishes—

- 1 (A) standards for each agency to develop
 2 an electronic identity proofing and authentica3 tion process for allowing an individual to pro4 vide a prior written electronic consent form for
 5 the disclosure of the individual's record under
 6 section 552a(b) of title 5, United States Code,
 7 or for individual access to a record under sec8 tion 552a(d) of such title; or
 - (B) a method by which each agency can electronically identity proof and authenticate an individual submitting an electronic consent form through a central online portal.
 - (2) Creates a template for an electronic consent form that can be properly identity proofed and authenticated in accordance with paragraph (1).
 - (3) Requires each agency to accept the electronic consent form described in paragraph (2) that provides consent from any individual properly identity proofed and authenticated in accordance with paragraph (1) from the individual providing consent or an entity other than the individual, including a congressional office, on behalf of the individual for the purpose of authorizing the disclosure of the individual's record in accordance with section 552a(b) or 552a(d) of title 5, United States Code.

1	(4) Authorizes each agency to provide an online
2	link to the consolidated online portal described under
3	subsection $(b)(1)$.
4	(b) Portal; Consent Identifier; Congressional
5	Function.—
6	(1) Consolidated online portal.—
7	(A) OPERATION OF PORTAL.—The Direc-
8	tor (or a designee) shall operate (or designate
9	the head of an agency to operate) a consoli-
10	dated online portal that allows a member of the
11	public to submit an electronic consent form in
12	accordance with the guidance issued pursuant
13	to subsection (a) to any agency from a single
14	website.
15	(B) Privacy and other features.—
16	The portal shall include features to protect the
17	privacy of individuals using the portal and may
18	include any additional functions the Director
19	finds will improve the implementation of this
20	section.
21	(C) Use of existing website or por-
22	TAL.—The Director may use any existing
23	website or portal to satisfy the requirements of
24	this subsection, including the portal established

under section 552(m) of title 5, United States
Code.

(2) Consent identifier.—The Director, or a designee, shall assign each consent form submitted through the portal described in paragraph (1) a consent identifier, which shall be provided to the agency and the individual or entity submitting the consent form. The agency shall track the consent form with the consent identifier.

(3) Congressional assistance function.—

(A) In General.—The Director, or a designee, shall ensure the operation of a function that allows a congressional office to provide a publicly available online link to the portal described in paragraph (1), which shall auto-populate information about such congressional office, including an indication of consent for such office to access a record in accordance with section 552a(b) of title 5, United States Code, in the consent form accessed through the portal.

(B) NOTIFICATION OF CONSENT IDENTI-FIER REQUIRED.— The Director, or a designee, shall ensure the function sends the consent identifier to the congressional office when a

1	consent form is submitted to an agency through
2	the portal as accessed through the function.
3	(c) AGENCY COMPLIANCE.—Each agency shall com-
4	ply with the guidance issued pursuant to subsection (a)
5	not later than 1 year after the date on which such guid-
6	ance is issued.
7	(d) Definitions.—In this section:
8	(1) AGENCY; INDIVIDUAL; RECORD.—The terms
9	"agency", "individual", and "record" have the
10	meanings given those terms in section 552a(a) of
11	title 5, United States Code.
12	(2) Consent identifier.—The term "consent
13	identifier" means a nonproprietary, unique identi-
14	fication number.
15	(3) Director.—The term "Director" means
16	the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-

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et.

1 SEC. 4. NO ADDITIONAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED.

- 2 No additional funds are authorized to carry out the
- 3 requirements of this Act. Such requirements shall be car-
- 4 ried out using amounts otherwise authorized.
