Ms. SPEIER (for herself and Ms. SCHAKOWSKY) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To prohibit the manufacture, sale, or distribution in commerce of any consumer product containing dimethylfumarate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “DMF Free Act of
5 2009”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON THE MANUFACTURE AND SALE OF**
7 **PRODUCTS CONTAINING DMF.**

8 (a) PROHIBITION.—Beginning on the date that is 90
9 days after the date of enactment of this Act, it shall be
10 unlawful for any person to manufacture for sale, offer for

1 sale, or distribute in commerce any consumer product con-
2 taining dimethylfumarate (DMF). Beginning on such
3 date, any consumer product that contains dimethylfuma-
4 rate shall be treated as a banned hazardous substance as
5 defined in section 2(q) of the Federal Hazardous Sub-
6 stance Act (15 U.S.C. 1261(q)).

7 (b) TREATMENT OF VIOLATION.—A violation of sub-
8 section (a) shall be treated as a violation of section
9 19(a)(1) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C.
10 2068(a)(1)).

11 (c) DEFINITION OF CONSUMER PRODUCT.—As used
12 in this Act, the term “consumer product” has the meaning
13 given such term in section 3(a)(1) of the Consumer Prod-
14 uct Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2052(a)(1)).

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
