To restore the rule that agreements between manufacturers and retailers, distributors, or wholesalers to set the price below which the manufacturer's product or service cannot be sold violates the Sherman Act. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
This Act may be cited as the "Discount Pricing Con sumer Protection Act of 2009".

6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON MINIMUM RESALE PRICE MAINTE7 NANCE.

8 Any agreement setting a price below which a product 9 or service cannot be sold by a retailer, wholesaler, or dis-10 tributor shall violate section 1 of the Sherman Act (15 11 U.S.C. 1).

12 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

13 This Act shall take effect 90 days after the date of14 the enactment of this Act.
