A BILL

To amend the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to require States to include information on the academic progress of homeless children and children in foster care in annual State report cards.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Homeless and Foster
5 Youth Achievement Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REQUIRED INFORMATION.**

2 Section 1111(h)(1)(C) of the Elementary and Sec-
3 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6311(h)(1)(C))
4 is amended—

5 (1) in clause (i), by inserting “, homeless sta-
6 tus, status as a child in foster care” after “English
7 proficiency”; and

8 (2) in clause (vi), by striking the semicolon at
9 the end and inserting “(and disaggregated by the
10 same categories and subject to the same exception as
11 described in clause (i));”.

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
