Mr. CÁRDENAS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

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## A BILL

To direct the Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Communications and Information to submit a report on the digital divide and to update the Indicators of Broadband Need mapping application, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. REPORT ON DIGITAL DIVIDE.**

4           (a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 1 year after  
5       the date of the enactment of this Act, and annually there-  
6       after for the subsequent 10-year period, the Assistant Sec-  
7       retary, in consultation with the Federal Communications  
8       Commission, shall submit to the Committee on Energy

1 and Commerce of the House of Representatives and the  
2 Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of  
3 the Senate, and make publicly available on the website of  
4 the NTIA, a report on the state of the digital divide, which  
5 shall include the following:

6                 (1) Information on and an analysis of—  
7                         (A) barriers to, and trends regarding,  
8                             broadband access, adoption, and affordability;  
9                         (B) the connection between—  
10                                 (i) broadband access, adoption, and  
11                                     affordability; and  
12                                 (ii) various socioeconomic indicators;  
13                         and  
14                         (C) the impact of Federal programs on  
15                             broadband access, adoption, and affordability.

16                 (2) An assessment of the sufficiency of existing  
17                     data collection and data sets with respect to the  
18                     analysis described in paragraph (1) and, if nec-  
19                     essary, recommendations for NTIA actions to im-  
20                     prove data quality.

21                 (3) Recommendations for legislative action to  
22                     facilitate closure of the digital divide.

23                 (b) ASSEMBLY PROCESS.—In assembling each report  
24                     required by subsection (a), the Assistant Secretary shall—

- 1                         (1) utilize all available and relevant data, in-  
2                         cluding data associated with the Indicators of  
3                         Broadband Need mapping application of the NTIA  
4                         and published research and data from individuals  
5                         and entities other than the NTIA;  
6                         (2) solicit public comment;  
7                         (3) hold public meetings with relevant stake-  
8                         holders; and  
9                         (4) consult with experts on and representatives  
10                         of communities that are unserved or underserved  
11                         with respect to broadband.

12 **SEC. 2. INDICATORS OF BROADBAND NEED MAPPING AP-**  
13 **PLICATION.**

- 14                         (a) UPDATE REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days  
15                         after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 180  
16                         days thereafter, the Assistant Secretary shall update the  
17                         Indicators of Broadband Need mapping application of the  
18                         NTIA to ensure that such application incorporates, and  
19                         includes display layers with respect to, the following:  
20                         (1) Data from the Broadband Data Collection  
21                         system of the Federal Communications Commission,  
22                         including data on availability and subscription rates  
23                         for broadband tiers with a download speed of more  
24                         than 25 megabits per second and an upload speed  
25                         of more than 3 megabits per second.

(2) Third-party data on the results of mobile network speed and signal strength tests.

(B) historically disadvantaged communities  
(as such term is used in section 6702 of title  
49, United States Code);

19 (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-  
20 tion may be construed to limit the authority of the Assist-  
21 ant Secretary to incorporate, as part of the Indicators of  
22 Broadband Need mapping application of the NTIA, ele-  
23 ments in addition to the elements identified in subsection  
24 (a).

1   **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

2       In this Act:

3           (1) ASSISTANT SECRETARY.—The term “Assist-  
4       ant Secretary” means the Assistant Secretary of  
5       Commerce for Communications and Information.

6           (2) NTIA.—The term “NTIA” means the Na-  
7       tional Telecommunications and Information Admin-  
8       istration.

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
