Mr. DUNCAN of Tennessee introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To amend title 41, United States Code, to require executive agencies to use competitive procedures for procurement contracts valued at an amount equal to or greater than \$10,000,000, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Stop Waste in Govern-
5 ment Contracting Act of 2017”.

1 **SEC. 2. COMPETITIVE PROCEDURES FOR PROCUREMENT**
2 **CONTRACTS EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN**
3 **\$10,000,000.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3301 of title 41, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing new subsection:

7 “(d) PROCUREMENT CONTRACTS EQUAL TO OR
8 GREATER THAN \$10,000,000.—Notwithstanding any
9 other provision of law, except as provided in section
10 3304(a)(6), an executive agency, in conducting a procure-
11 ment for property or services valued at an amount equal
12 to or greater than \$10,000,000, shall use competitive pro-
13 cedures, in accordance with the requirements of this sec-
14 tion.”.

15 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (d) of section 3301
16 of title 41, United States Code, as added by subsection
17 (a), shall apply with respect to solicitations issued on or
18 after the date that is 90 days after the date of the enact-
19 ment of this Act.

20 **SEC. 3. REPORT ON FEDERAL PROCUREMENT DATA SYS-**
21 **TEM.**

22 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
23 date of the enactment of this Act, the Inspector General
24 of the General Services Administration shall submit to the
25 Committee on Oversight and Government Reform of the
26 House of Representatives a report—

1 (1) on updating the Federal Procurement Data
2 System and data stored on such system during the
3 preceding 10-year period;

4 (2) that identifies any issues of each executive
5 agency relating to the use of the Federal Procure-
6 ment Data System that may have affected the reli-
7 ability of the data stored on such system;

8 (3) that details, to the extent practicable, which
9 data is potentially unreliable; and

10 (4) that includes recommendations for improv-
11 ing the Federal Procurement Data System.

12 (b) EXECUTIVE AGENCY DEFINED.—In this section,
13 the term “executive agency” has the meaning given that
14 term in section 133 of title 41, United States Code.

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
