3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Saving Over Spending5 Act".

1SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF AVAILABILITY OF YEAR-END SAV-2INGS IN SALARIES AND EXPENSES.

3 (a) APPLICATION TO 50 PERCENT OF SAVINGS.—
4 Section 1502 of title 31, United States Code, is amend5 ed—

6 (1) in subsection (a), by striking "The" and in7 serting "Except as provided in subsection (c), the";
8 and

9 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-10 section:

11 "(c) Notwithstanding subsection (a), 50 percent of an unobligated balance available for salaries and expenses 12 that would otherwise expire at the end of a fiscal year 13 shall remain available for expenditure for the subsequent 14 fiscal year, and 50 percent shall be used for the purpose 15 16 of deficit reduction on return to the general fund of the 17 Treasury. Unobligated balances carried forward to a sub-18 sequent fiscal year under this subsection may not be taken 19 into account in determining the amount by which an agen-20 cy will be funded for such subsequent fiscal year.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
subsection (a) shall be effective with respect to unobligated
balances of amounts made available after the date of the
enactment of this Act.
