Mr. JOHNSON of Louisiana introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To require the inclusion of audit information on the website required by the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Increasing Trans-
5 parency in Federal Audits Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF AUDIT INFORMATION ON**
2 **USASPENDING.GOV.**

3 (a) AMENDMENTS.—Section 2 of the Federal Fund-
4 ing Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (31
5 U.S.C. 6101 note) is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (a)(7)—

7 (A) in subparagraph (C), by striking “;
8 and” and inserting a semicolon;

9 (B) in subparagraph (D), by striking the
10 period at the end and inserting “; and”; and

11 (C) by inserting at the end the following
12 new subparagraph:

13 “(E) search for and download the results
14 of any audit performed pursuant to chapter 75
15 of title 31, United States Code.”; and

16 (2) in subsection (b), by inserting at the end
17 the following new paragraph:

18 “(5) INCLUSION OF AUDIT INFORMATION ON
19 WEBSITE.—

20 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The website described
21 in paragraph (1) shall include the results of any
22 audit performed pursuant to chapter 75 of title
23 31, United States Code.

24 “(B) COORDINATION.—The Secretary shall
25 coordinate the transfer of the following:

1 “(i) The results of any audit per-
2 formed pursuant to chapter 75 of title 31,
3 United States Code.

4 “(ii) Any other information the Sec-
5 retary determines to be necessary to meet
6 the requirements of this paragraph.”.

7 (b) REPORT REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180
8 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the
9 Comptroller General, in consultation with the Inspector
10 General of the Department of the Treasury, shall submit
11 to Congress either—

12 (1) a certification that this Act, and the amend-
13 ments made by this Act, have been fully imple-
14 mented; or

15 (2) if this Act, and the amendments made by
16 this Act, have not been fully implemented, the status
17 of such implementation, including any recommenda-
18 tions, as necessary.

19 (c) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by sub-
20 section (a) shall apply with respect to any audit conducted
21 under chapter 75 of title 31, United States Code, at any
22 time.

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
