A BILL

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Stop Inflationary
3 Spending Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE INFLATION**
5 **ANALYSIS.**

6 (a) CBO INFLATION ANALYSIS.—Section 310 of the
7 Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of
8 1974 (2 U.S.C. 641) is amended by adding at the end
9 the following new subsection:

10 “(h) CBO ANALYSIS.—The Director of the Congres-
11 sional Budget Office shall, to the extent practicable, pre-
12 pare an analysis of the impact on inflation incurred in car-
13 rying out reconciliation legislation in the fiscal year in
14 which it is to become effective and in each of the 4 fiscal
15 years following such fiscal year, together with the basis
16 for each such estimate, for any reconciliation legislation
17 that is—

18 “(1) reported to a House under subsection
19 (b)(1);

20 “(2) submitted to a Committee on the Budget
21 of a House under subsection (b)(2); or

22 “(3) submitted directly to the Committee on
23 Rules of the House of Representatives.”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section and the amend-
2 ments made by this section shall take effect on the date
3 of enactment of this Act.

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
