## A BILL

To require generative artificial intelligence to disclose that their output has been generated by artificial intelligence, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “AI Disclosure Act of  
5 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT TO DISCLOSE USE OF GENERATIVE**  
7 **ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE.**

8 (a) **DISCLAIMER REQUIRED.**—Generative artificial  
9 intelligence shall include on any output generated by such

1 artificial intelligence the following: “Disclaimer: this out-  
2 put has been generated by artificial intelligence.”.

3 (b) ENFORCEMENT BY FEDERAL TRADE COMMIS-  
4 SION.—

5 (1) UNFAIR OR DECEPTIVE ACTS OR PRAC-  
6 TICES.—A violation of subsection (a) or a regulation  
7 promulgated under such subsection shall be treated  
8 as a violation of a regulation under section  
9 18(a)(1)(B) of the Federal Trade Commission Act  
10 (15 U.S.C. 57a(a)(1)(B)) regarding unfair or decep-  
11 tive acts or practices.

12 (2) POWERS OF COMMISSION.—The Federal  
13 Trade Commission shall enforce subsection (a) and  
14 the regulations promulgated under such subsection  
15 in the same manner, by the same means, and with  
16 the same jurisdiction, powers, and duties as though  
17 all applicable terms and provisions of the Federal  
18 Trade Commission Act (15 U.S.C. 41 et seq.) were  
19 incorporated into and made a part of this Act. Any  
20 person who violates such subsection or a regulation  
21 promulgated under such subsection shall be subject  
22 to the penalties and entitled to the privileges and  
23 immunities provided in the Federal Trade Commis-  
24 sion Act.
