A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to disallow a deduction for amounts paid or incurred by a responsible party relating to a discharge of oil.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. DENIAL OF DEDUCTION FOR AMOUNTS PAID

4 OR INCURRED BY A RESPONSIBLE PARTY.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 162 of the Internal Rev-

6 enue Code of 1986 is amended by redesignating subsection

7 (q) as subsection (r) and by inserting after subsection (p)

8 the following new subsection:

1 "(q) CERTAIN EXPENSES OF A RESPONSIBLE 2 Party.—

3 "(1) IN GENERAL.—No deduction shall be al4 lowed under subsection (a) for any amount paid or
5 incurred by a responsible party relating to any inci6 dent resulting in the discharge of oil into the navi7 gable waters, other than an incident caused by an
8 act of God or an act of war.

9 "(2) DEFINITIONS.—Any term used in para-10 graph (1) which is also used in the Oil Pollution Act 11 of 1990 shall have the meaning given such term by 12 such Act.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
this section shall apply to returns of tax the due date of
which (including extensions of time) is after the date of
the enactment of this Act.
