AN ACT

- To provide for identifying and eliminating redundant reporting requirements and developing meaningful performance metrics for homeland security preparedness grants, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Redundancy Elimi3 nation and Enhanced Performance for Preparedness
4 Grants Act".

5 SEC. 2. IDENTIFICATION OF REPORTING REDUNDANCIES
6 AND DEVELOPMENT OF PERFORMANCE
7 METRICS FOR HOMELAND SECURITY PRE8 PAREDNESS GRANT PROGRAMS.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title XX of the Homeland Secu10 rity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 601 et seq.) is amended by
11 adding at the end the following new section:

12 "SEC.2023.IDENTIFICATIONOFREPORTING13REDUNDANCIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF PER-14FORMANCE METRICS.

15 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall, for 16 grants under sections 2003 and 2004 and any other grants specified by the Administrator, submit a report to 17 18 the appropriate committees of Congress by not later than 19 120 days after the date of the enactment of the Redundancy Elimination and Enhanced Performance for Pre-20 paredness Grants Act, and by October 1st every 2 years 21 22 thereafter, that—

"(1) identifies redundant rules, regulations, and
requirements for reporting by recipients of such
grants, and includes a plan for eliminating such
identified redundancies and requirements;

1 "(2) includes a plan for developing and improv-2 ing the performance metrics required under section 3 2022(a)(4) for such grants; and "(3) includes an assessment of each program 4 5 under which such grants are awarded. "(b) PLAN REQUIREMENTS.—Each plan under sub-6 7 section (a)— "(1) shall be developed in coordination with 8 9 State, local, tribal, and territorial governments; and "(2) shall include a proposed timeline for ac-10 11 tions to implement the plan. "(c) PROGRAM ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS.—Each 12 program assessment under subsection (a)(3) shall in-13 14 clude— "(1) a brief summary of the program purposes, 15 16 objectives, and performance goals, and of the key 17 findings of the assessment; 18 ((2) an assessment of the quality of the pro-19 gram's performance metrics, and the extent to which 20 necessary performance data are collected; "(3) a summary of how the program's strengths 21 22 and weaknesses are impeding or contributing to its 23 failures or successes, including reasons for any sub-24 stantial variation from the targeted level of perform-25 ance of the program;

1	"(4) a description of the extent to which any
2	trends, developments, or emerging conditions affect
3	the need to change the mission of the program or
4	the way that the program is being carried out;
5	"(5) an identification of the best practices used
6	in the program for allocating resources in an effi-
7	cient and effective manner that resulted in positive
8	outcomes and the key reasons why such practices re-
9	sulted in positive outcomes;
10	"(6) recommendations for program modifica-
11	tions to improve the results that the program
12	achieves;
13	"(7) a summary of key results of the program
14	assessment that support maximizing the amount of
15	funds appropriated for the program; and
16	"(8) an assessment of the quality of customer
17	service offered to recipients of funds under the pro-
18	gram and a strategy for improving such service.".
19	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
20	in section 1(b) of such Act is amended by adding at the
21	end of the items relating to title XX the following new
22	item:

"Sec. 2023. Identification of reporting redundancies and development of performance metrics.".
