# <sup>115TH CONGRESS</sup> 2D SESSION H.R.3994

## AN ACT

To establish the Office of Internet Connectivity and Growth, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Advancing Critical
3 Connectivity Expands Service, Small Business Resources,
4 Opportunities, Access, and Data Based on Assessed Need
5 and Demand Act" or the "ACCESS BROADBAND Act".
6 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE OFFICE OF INTERNET
7 CONNECTIVITY AND GROWTH.

8 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-9 ment of this Act, the Assistant Secretary shall establish 10 the Office of Internet Connectivity and Growth within the 11 National Telecommunications and Information Adminis-12 tration.

**13 SEC. 3. DUTIES.** 

14 (a) OUTREACH.—The Office shall—

(1) connect with communities that need access
to high-speed internet and improved digital inclusion
efforts through various forms of outreach and communication techniques;

19 (2) hold regional workshops across the country
20 to share best practices and effective strategies for
21 promoting broadband access and adoption;

(3) develop targeted broadband training and
presentations for various demographic communities
through various media; and

25 (4) develop and distribute publications (includ26 ing toolkits, primers, manuals, and white papers)

providing guidance, strategies, and insights to com munities as the communities develop strategies to
 expand broadband access and adoption.
 (b) TRACKING OF FEDERAL DOLLARS.—
 (1) BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE.—The Of-

6 fice shall track the construction and use of and ac7 cess to any broadband infrastructure built using any
8 Federal support in a central database.

9 (2)ACCOUNTING MECHANISM.—The Office shall develop a streamlined accounting mechanism 10 11 by which any agency offering a Federal broadband 12 support program and the Commission through the 13 Universal Service Fund shall provide the information 14 described in paragraph (1) in a standardized and ef-15 ficient fashion.

16 (3) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the 17 date of the enactment of this Act, and every year 18 thereafter, the Office shall make public on the 19 website of the Office and submit to the Committee 20 on Energy and Commerce of the House of Rep-21 resentatives and the Committee on Commerce, 22 Science, and Transportation of the Senate a report 23 on the following:

24 (A) A description of the work of the Office25 for the previous year and the number of resi-

1	dents of the United States that received
2	broadband as result of Federal broadband sup-
3	port programs and the Universal Service Fund
4	program.
5	(B) A description of how many residents of
6	the United States were provided broadband by
7	which universal service mechanism or which
8	Federal broadband support program.
9	(C) An estimate of the economic impact of
10	such broadband deployment efforts on the local
11	economy, including any effect on small busi-
12	nesses or jobs.
13	SEC. 4. STREAMLINED APPLICATIONS FOR SUPPORT.
14	(a) Agency Consultation.—The Office shall con-
15	sult with any agency offering a Federal broadband support
16	program to streamline and standardize the applications
17	process for financial assistance or grants for such pro-
18	gram.
19	(b) AGENCY STREAMLINING.—Any agency offering a
20	Federal broadband support program shall amend their ap-
21	plications for broadband support, to the extent practicable

and as necessary, to streamline and standardize applica-tions for Federal broadband support programs across the

24 Government.

(c) SINGLE APPLICATION.—To the greatest extent
 practicable, the Office shall seek to create one application
 that may be submitted to apply for all, or substantially
 all, Federal broadband support programs.

(d) WEBSITE REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Office shall
create a central website through which potential applicants
can learn about and apply for support through any Federal broadband support program.

#### 10 SEC. 5. COORDINATION OF SUPPORT.

11 The Office, any agency that offers a Federal 12 broadband support program, and the Commission through 13 the Universal Service Fund shall coordinate with the Office to ensure that support is being distributed in an effi-14 15 cient, technology-neutral, and financially sustainable manner, with the goal of serving the largest number of persons 16 17 in the United States while avoiding overbuilding and promoting the most job and economic growth for all residents 18 19 of the United States.

#### 20 SEC. 6. DEFINITIONS.

21 In this Act:

(1) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
meaning given that term in section 551 of title 5,
United States Code.

(2) ASSISTANT SECRETARY.—The term "Assist ant Secretary" means the Assistant Secretary of
 Commerce for Communications and Information.

4 (3) COMMISSION.—The term "Commission"
5 means the Federal Communications Commission.

6 FEDERAL BROADBAND (4)SUPPORT PRO-7 GRAM.—The term "Federal broadband support pro-8 gram" does not include any Universal Service Fund 9 program and means any of the following programs 10 (or any other similar Federal program) to the extent 11 the program offers broadband internet service or 12 programs for promoting broadband access and adop-13 tion for various demographic communities through 14 various media for residential, commercial, commu-15 nity providers, or academic establishments:

16 (A) The Telecommunications and Tech17 nology Program of the Appalachian Regional
18 Commission.

(B) The Telecommunications Infrastructure Loans and Loan Guarantees, the Rural
Broadband Access Loans and Loan Guarantees,
the Substantially Underserved Trust Areas Provisions, the Community Connect Grant Program, and the Distance Learning and Tele-

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1	medicine Grant Program of the Rural Utilities
2	Service of the Department of Agriculture.
3	(C) The Public Works and Economic Ad-
4	justment Assistance Programs and the Plan-
5	ning and Local Technical Assistance Programs
6	of the Economic Development Administration of
7	the Department of Commerce.
8	(D) The Community Development Block
9	Grants and Section 108 Loan Guarantees, the
10	Funds for Public Housing Authorities: Capital
11	Fund and Operating Fund, the Multifamily
12	Housing, the Indian Community Development
13	Block Grant Program, the Indian Housing
14	Block Grant Program, the Title VI Loan Guar-
15	antee Program, Choice Neighborhoods, the
16	HOME Investment Partnerships Program, the
17	Housing Trust Fund, and the Housing Oppor-
18	tunities for Persons with AIDS of the Depart-
19	ment of Housing and Urban Development.
20	(E) The American Job Centers of the Em-
21	ployment and Training Administration of the
22	Department of Labor.
23	(F) The Library Services and Technology
24	Grant Programs of the Institute of Museum
25	and Library Services.

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(5) OFFICE.—The term "Office" means the Of fice of Internet Connectivity and Growth established
 pursuant to section 2.

4 (6) UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND PROGRAM.—The
5 term "Universal Service Fund program" means any
6 program authorized under section 254 of the Com7 munications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 254) to help de8 ploy broadband.

9 (7) UNIVERSAL SERVICE MECHANISM.—The
10 term "universal service mechanism" means any
11 funding stream provided by a Universal Service
12 Fund program to support broadband access.

### 13 SEC. 7. NO ADDITIONAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED.

14 No additional funds are authorized to be appro15 priated to carry out this Act. This Act shall be carried
16 out using amounts otherwise authorized.
