10	(2) other health care practitioners and the pub						
11	lic on a pharmacist's responsibility to decline to fil						
12	prescriptions in certain circumstances.						
13	(c) STAKEHOLDER INPUT.—In developing the pro-						
14	grams and materials required under subsection (a), the						
15	Secretary of Health and Human Services shall seek input						
16	from relevant national, State, and local associations						
17	boards of pharmacy, medical societies, licensing boards						
18	health care practitioners, and patients.
