Mr. Crowley (for himself and Mr. Brady of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain footwear, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Affordable Footwear
- 5 Act of 2009".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) Average collected duties on imported foot-
- 9 wear are among the highest of any product sector,
- 10 totaling approximately \$1,700,000,000 during 2008.

- 1 (2) Duty rates on imported footwear are among 2 the highest imposed by the United States Govern-3 ment, with some as high as the equivalent of 67.5 4 percent ad valorem.
 - (3) The duties currently imposed by the United States were set in an era during which high rates of duty were intended to protect production of footwear in the United States.
 - (4) Footwear produced in the United States supplies only about 1 percent of the total United States market for footwear. This production is concentrated in distinct product groupings, which are not affected by the provisions of this Act.
 - (5) Low- and moderate-income families spend a larger share of their disposable income on footwear than higher-income families.
 - (6) Footwear duties, which are higher on lowerprice footwear, serve no purpose and are a hidden, regressive tax on those people in the United States least able to pay.

21 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

- 22 It is the sense of Congress that—
- 23 (1) the reduction or elimination of duties on the 24 importation of certain footwear articles would pro-

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1	vide significant benefits to United States consumers
2	particularly lower-income families;
3	(2) there is no production in the United States
4	of many footwear articles;
5	(3) the reduction or elimination of duties or
6	such articles will not negatively affect manufacturing
7	or employment in the United States; and
8	(4) the reduction or elimination of duties or
9	such articles will result in reduced retail prices for
10	consumers.

- 8 consistent with the classification of such footwear in Clas-
- 9 sification Opinions 6404.19/1, 6404.19/2, and 6405.20/1
- 10 of the Harmonized System Committee of the World Cus-
- 11 toms Organization.
