A BILL

To amend the Clean Air Act to modify the ethanol waiver for the Reid Vapor Pressure limitations under that Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Year-Round Fuel
5 Choice Act of 2021”.

1 **SEC. 2. ETHANOL WAIVER.**

2 Section 211 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7545)
3 is amended—

4 (1) in subsection (f)(4)—

5 (A) by striking “(4) The Administrator,
6 upon” and inserting the following:

7 “(4) WAIVER.—

8 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator,
9 on”; and

10 (B) by adding at the end the following:

11 “(B) REID VAPOR PRESSURE.—A fuel or
12 fuel additive that has been granted a waiver
13 under subparagraph (A) prior to January 1,
14 2017, and meets all the conditions of that waiv-
15 er other than any limitations of the waiver with
16 respect to Reid Vapor Pressure, may be intro-
17 duced into commerce if the fuel or fuel additive
18 meets all other applicable Reid Vapor Pressure
19 requirements.”; and

20 (2) in subsection (h)—

21 (A) in paragraph (4)—

22 (i) in the matter preceding subpara-
23 graph (A), by inserting “or more” after
24 “10 percent”; and

25 (ii) in subparagraph (C), by striking
26 “additional alcohol or”; and

1 (B) in paragraph (5)(A), by inserting “or
2 more” after “10 percent”.
