- To direct the Under Secretary for Management of the Department of Homeland Security to assess contracts for covered services performed by contractor personnel along the United States land border with Mexico, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "DHS Border Services				
3	Contracts Review Act".				
4	SEC. 2. ASSESSMENT OF CONTRACTS FOR COVERED SERV-				
5	ICES BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND				
6	SECURITY.				
7	(a) Report.—				
8	(1) In general.—Not later than 180 days				
9	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the				
10	Under Secretary for Management of the Departmen				
11	of Homeland Security, in consultation with appro-				
12	priate officials of the Department, shall submit to				
13	the appropriate congressional committees a repor				
14	regarding active contracts for covered services of the				
15	Department awarded on or before—				
16	(A) September 30, 2023, or				
17	(B) the date of the enactment of this Act				
18	whichever occurs later.				
19	(2) Elements.—The report required under				
20	paragraph (1) shall include the following:				
21	(A) The criteria used by the Department				
22	of Homeland Security to determine whether				
23	contractor personnel were necessary to assist				
24	the Department in carrying out its mission				
25	along the United States land border with Mex-				
26	ico.				

1	(B) An analysis of the purpose, quantity,
2	and location of contractor personnel to perform
3	covered services of the Department with respect
4	to effectively—
5	(i) addressing mission needs along
6	such border; and
7	(ii) enhancing the capability of De-
8	partment personnel to perform primary
9	mission responsibilities, including the num-
0	ber of Department personnel not removed
1	from their primary mission responsibilities
2	by reason of the performance of covered
3	services by contractor personnel.
4	(C) An assessment with respect to the ben-
5	efits of contractor personnel performing covered
6	services, including whether the performance of
7	such services by contractor personnel is more
8	efficient or effective than the performance of
9	such services by Department employees.
20	(D) An assessment of opportunities to in-
21	crease the efficiency of the Department with re-
22	spect to contracting, including whether Depart-
23	ment-wide contract vehicles for covered services
24	would be the most cost effective option for the

performance of covered services.

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1	(E) A strategy to improve the procurement
2	and delivery of covered services through con-
3	tracts during the five-year period beginning on
4	the date of the enactment of this Act to—
5	(i) achieve the best value for the De-
6	partment through the use of full and open
7	competition; and
8	(ii) ensure no lapse in the perform-
9	ance of such services.
10	(F) Recommendations based on findings
11	resulting from the analysis and assessments re-
12	quired in subparagraphs (B) through (D).
13	(G) Any other information relating to con-
14	tracts for covered services that the Under Sec-
15	retary for Management determines appropriate.
16	(b) Implementation Plan.—
17	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Under Secretary for
18	Management shall submit with the report required
19	under subsection (a) a plan to implement the rec-
20	ommendations and strategy contained in such report
21	to enhance coordination, minimize overlap, and in-
22	crease cost effectiveness among contracts for covered
23	services.
24	(2) Briefing.—Not later than 180 days after
25	the date on which the Under Secretary for Manage-

1 ment submits the report required under subsection 2 (a) and the plan required under paragraph (1) and 3 every 180 days thereafter until such plan is fully implemented, the Under Secretary, or the designee of the Under Secretary, shall provide to the appro-5 6 priate congressional committees a briefing with re-7 spect to the status of such implementation. 8 (c) Prohibition on Funding.—No funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section. This 10 section shall be carried out using amounts otherwise authorized to be made available for such purposes. 12 (d) Definitions.—In this section: 13 APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT-TEES.—The term "appropriate congressional com-14 15 mittees" means— 16 (A) the Committee on Homeland Security 17 of the House of Representatives; and 18 (B) the Committee on Homeland Security 19 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate. 20 (2) Contract for covered services.—The term "contract for covered services" means a con-21 22 tract (with a total contract value of \$50,000,000 or 23 more in 2023 constant dollars, inclusive of contract 24 options) relating to the procurement of covered serv-25 ices for the Department of Homeland Security.

1	(3) COVERED SERVICES.—The term "covered						
2	services" means, with respect to the United States						
3	land border with Mexico, any service, including re-						
4	lated to border security, provided by a contractor to						
5	be used by the Department.
