Ms. CASTOR of Florida (for herself and Mr. HUNTER) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To require career and technical education for maritime careers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Seafarers Educational
5 Advancement Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION LEADING TO**
7 **MARITIME CAREERS.**

8 Section 135(b) of the Carl D. Perkins Career and
9 Technical Education Act of 2006 (20 U.S.C. 2355(b)) is
10 amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (8), by striking “and” at the
2 end;

3 (2) in paragraph (9), by striking the period at
4 the end and inserting “; and”; and

5 (3) by adding at the end the following new
6 paragraph:

7 “(10) provide career and technical education at
8 the secondary level that leads to maritime careers,
9 including a career in marine construction, commer-
10 cial diving and marine salvaging, container sales,
11 dredging, environmental, marine, or ship engineer-
12 ing, marine and science research, maritime tech-
13 nology, stevedoring, ship repair, trucking and towing
14 and tug services, admiralty or maritime legal serv-
15 ices, the cruise industry, as a member of a ship crew
16 (such as a captain, mate, seaman, or engineer), or
17 as a member of the Navy or Coast Guard.”.
