A BILL

To prohibit the use of premiums paid to the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation as an offset for other Federal spending.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Pension and Budget
5 Integrity Act of 2021”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF PREMIUMS AS AN**
2 **OFFSET.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—In the Senate and the House of
4 Representatives, for purposes of determining points of
5 order under the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 (2
6 U.S.C. 621 et seq.) or any concurrent resolution on the
7 budget, any provision that increases, or extends the in-
8 crease of, any single-employer pension program premiums
9 payable to the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation
10 shall not be counted in estimating the level of budget au-
11 thority, outlays, or revenues—

12 (1) in the Senate, for any bill, joint resolution,
13 amendment, amendment between the Houses, con-
14 ference report, or motion; or

15 (2) in the House of Representatives, for any bill
16 or joint resolution, or amendment thereto or con-
17 ference report thereon.

18 (b) RULES OF SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENT-
19 ATIVES.—Congress adopts the provisions of this section—

20 (1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of
21 the Senate and the House of Representatives, re-
22 spectively, and as such is deemed a part of the rules
23 of each House, respectively, and supersede other
24 rules only to the extent that they are inconsistent
25 with such rules; and

1 (2) with full recognition of the constitutional
2 right of either House to change the rules (so far as
3 relating to the procedure of that House) at any time,
4 in the same manner, and to the same extent as in
5 the case of any other rule of that House.

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
