1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Enhancing Edu-5 cational Opportunities for Home School Students Act".

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 529(c)(7) of the Internal
10 Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by striking "include

3	"(A) expenses for tuition in connection		
4	with enrollment or attendance at an elementary		
5	or secondary public, private, or religious school,		
6	and		
7	"(B) expenses for—		
8	"(i) curriculum and curricular mate-		
9	rials,		
10	"(ii) books or other instructional ma-		
11	terials,		
12	"(iii) online educational materials,		
13	"(iv) tuition for tutoring or edu-		
14	cational classes outside of the home (but		
15	only if the tutor or instructor is not related		
16	(within the meaning of section $152(d)(2)$)		
17	to the student),		
18	"(v) dual enrollment in an institution		
19	of higher education, and		
20	"(vi) educational therapies for stu-		
21	dents with disabilities,		
22	in connection with a homeschool (whether treat-		
23	ed as a homeschool or a private school for pur-

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
 this section shall apply to distributions made after the
 date of the enactment of this Act.
