## A BILL

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To provide for the training of Federal building personnel, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Buildings Per-5 sonnel Training Act of 2010".

#### 6 SEC. 2. TRAINING OF FEDERAL BUILDING PERSONNEL.

7 (a) Identification of Core Competencies.—Not later than 18 months after the date of enactment of this 8 9 Act, and annually thereafter, the Administrator of General 10 Services, in consultation with representatives of relevant professional societies, industry associations, and appren-11 12 ticeship training providers, and after providing notice and 13 an opportunity for comment, shall identify the core competencies necessary for Federal personnel performing 14 15 building operations and maintenance, energy management, safety, and design functions to comply with require-16 ments under Federal law. The core competencies identified 17 18 shall include competencies relating to building operations 19 and maintenance, energy management, sustainability, 20 water efficiency, safety (including electrical safety), and 21 building performance measures.

(b) DESIGNATION OF RELEVANT COURSES, CERTIFICATIONS, DEGREES, LICENSES, AND REGISTRATIONS.—
The Administrator, in consultation with representatives of
relevant professional societies, industry associations, and

apprenticeship training providers, shall identify a course,
 certification, degree, license, or registration to dem onstrate each core competency, and for ongoing training
 with respect to each core competency, identified for a cat gory of personnel specified in subsection (a).

6 IDENTIFIED COMPETENCIES.—An individual (c)7 shall demonstrate each core competency identified by the 8 Administrator under subsection (a) for the category of 9 personnel that includes such individual. An individual 10 shall demonstrate each core competency through the means identified under subsection (b) not later than one 11 year after the date on which such core competency is iden-12 13 tified under subsection (a) or, if the date of hire of such individual occurs after the date of such identification, not 14 15 later than one year after such date of hire. In the case of an individual hired for an employment period not to 16 17 exceed one year, such individual shall demonstrate each 18 core competency at the start of the employment period. 19 (d) CONTINUING EDUCATION.—The Administrator, 20 in consultation with representatives of relevant profes-

21 sional societies, industry associations, and apprenticeship
22 training providers, shall develop or identify comprehensive
23 continuing education courses to ensure the operation of
24 Federal buildings in accordance with industry best prac25 tices and standards.

(e) CURRICULUM WITH RESPECT TO FACILITY MAN-1 2 AND OPERATION OF HIGH-PERFORMANCE AGEMENT BUILDINGS.—Not later than 18 months after the date of 3 4 enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Ad-5 ministrator, acting through the head of the Office of Federal High-Performance Green Buildings, and the Sec-6 7 retary of Energy, acting through the head of the Office 8 of Commercial High-Performance Green Buildings, in 9 consultation with the heads of other appropriate Federal 10 departments and agencies and representatives of relevant professional societies, industry associations, and appren-11 12 ticeship training providers, shall develop a recommended 13 curriculum relating to facility management and the oper-14 ation of high-performance buildings.

15 (f) APPLICABILITY OF THIS SECTION TO FUNCTIONS PERFORMED UNDER CONTRACT.—Training requirements 16 under this section shall apply to non-Federal personnel 17 18 performing building operations and maintenance, energy management, safety, and design functions under a con-19 20 tract with a Federal department or agency. A contractor 21 shall provide training to, and certify the demonstration of 22 core competencies for, non-Federal personnel in a manner that is approved by the Administrator. 23
