# To authorize appropriations for the Housing Assistance Council.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Housing Assistance

5 Council Program Reauthorization Act of 2010".

## 6 SEC. 2. ASSISTANCE TO HOUSING ASSISTANCE COUNCIL.

7 (a) USE.—The Secretary of Housing and Urban De8 velopment may provide financial assistance to the Housing
9 Assistance Council for use by such Council to develop the
10 ability and capacity of community-based housing develop-

ment organizations to undertake community development 1 2 and affordable housing projects and programs in rural 3 areas. Assistance provided by the Secretary under this sec-4 tion may be used by the Housing Assistance Council for— 5 (1) technical assistance, training, support, and 6 advice to develop the business and administrative ca-7 pabilities of rural community-based housing develop-8 ment organizations; 9 (2) loans, grants, or other financial assistance 10 to rural community-based housing development orga-11 nizations to carry out community development and 12 affordable housing activities for low- and moderate-13 income families; and 14 (3) such other activities as may be determined 15 by the Housing Assistance Council. 16 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is 17 authorized to be appropriated for financial assistance 18 under this section for the Housing Assistance Council— 19 (1) \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 2012; and 20 (2) \$15,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2013, 21 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017.
