#### 113TH CONGRESS 2D SESSION H.R. 5135

### **AN ACT**

To direct the Interagency Task Force to Monitor and Combat Trafficking to identify strategies to prevent children from becoming victims of trafficking and review trafficking prevention efforts, to protect and assist in the recovery of victims of trafficking, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Trafficking5 Prevention, Intervention, and Recovery Act of 2014".

## 6 SEC. 2. INTERAGENCY TASK FORCE REPORT ON CHILD 7 TRAFFICKING PRIMARY PREVENTION.

8 (a) REVIEW.—The Interagency Task Force to Mon-9 itor and Combat Trafficking, established under section 10 105 of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 11 U.S.C. 7103), shall conduct a review that, with regard to 12 trafficking in persons in the United States—

(1) in consultation with nongovernmental organizations that the Task Force determines appropriate, surveys and catalogues the activities of the
Federal Government and State governments to deter
individuals from committing trafficking offenses and
to prevent children from becoming victims of trafficking;

20 (2) surveys academic literature on deterring in21 dividuals from committing trafficking offenses, pre22 venting children from becoming victims of traf23 ficking, the commercial sexual exploitation of chil24 dren, and other similar topics that the Task Force
25 determines appropriate;

(3) identifies best practices and effective strate gies to deter individuals from committing trafficking
 offenses and to prevent children from becoming vic tims of trafficking; and

5 (4) identifies current gaps in research and data 6 that would be helpful in formulating effective strate-7 gies to deter individuals from committing trafficking 8 offenses and to prevent children from becoming vic-9 tims of trafficking.

10 (b) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date 11 of the enactment of this Act, the Interagency Task Force 12 to Monitor and Combat Trafficking shall provide to Con-13 gress, and make publicly available in electronic format, a 14 report on the review conducted pursuant to subparagraph 15 (a).

#### 16 SEC. 3. GAO REPORT ON INTERVENTION.

On the date that is one year after the date of the
enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the
United States shall submit to Congress a report, which
shall include—

(1) information on the efforts of Federal and
select State law enforcement agencies to combat
human trafficking in the United States; and

24 (2) information on each Federal grant program,25 a purpose of which is to combat human trafficking

or assist victims of trafficking, as specified in an au thorizing statute or in a guidance document issued
 by the agency carrying out the grant program.

4 SEC. 4. PROVISION OF HOUSING PERMITTED TO PROTECT
5 AND ASSIST IN THE RECOVERY OF VICTIMS
6 OF TRAFFICKING.

7 Section 107(b)(2)(A) of the Trafficking Victims Pro8 tection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C. 7105(b)(2)(A)) is amended
9 by inserting before the period at the end the following:
10 ", including programs that provide housing to victims of
11 trafficking".

#### 12 SEC. 5. VICTIM OF TRAFFICKING DEFINED.

In this Act, the term and "victim of trafficking" has
the meaning given such term in section 103 of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C. 7102).
