Ms. CARAVEO (for herself, Mr. VASQUEZ, Ms. SLOTKIN, and Ms. PETTERSEN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture

A BILL

To amend the Food Security Act of 1985 to require the Secretary of Agriculture to establish a small farm EQIP subprogram under the environmental quality incentives program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Small Farm Conserva-
5 tion Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. SMALL FARM EQIP SUBPROGRAM.**

7 Section 1240B of the Food Security Act of 1985 (16
8 U.S.C. 3839aa–2) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (d)—

2 (A) by striking paragraph (1) and insert-
3 ing the following:

4 “(1) AVAILABILITY; MINIMUM AMOUNT.—

5 “(A) AVAILABILITY.—A payment provided
6 to a producer under the program shall be used
7 to implement 1 or more practices under the
8 program.

9 “(B) MINIMUM AMOUNT.—The amount of
10 a payment provided to a producer under the
11 program shall be not less than \$2,500.”;

12 (B) in paragraph (2), in the matter pre-
13 ceding subparagraph (A), by striking “A pay-
14 ment” and inserting “Subject to paragraph
15 (1)(B), a payment”; and

16 (C) by adding at the end the following:

17 “(8) SOIL HEALTH MANAGEMENT SYSTEM PAY-
18 MENTS.—

19 “(A) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding para-
20 graph (2), the Secretary shall increase the
21 amount that would otherwise be provided for
22 practices comprising a soil health management
23 system on a farm by 50 percent for any appli-
24 cation for a soil health management system on
25 an operation of not more than 50 acres.

1 “(B) RAPID AND STREAMLINED APPLICA-
2 TION AND CONTRACT APPROVAL.—The Sec-
3 retary shall provide payments under this para-
4 graph on a continuous enrollment basis, using
5 a rapid and streamlined application and con-
6 tract approval process.”;

7 (2) in subsection (f), by adding at the end the
8 following:

9 “(3) SMALL FARM EQIP SUBPROGRAM.—

10 “(A) TOTAL FUNDING.—For each of fiscal
11 years 2024 through 2028, not less than
12 \$100,000,000 of the funds made available for
13 payments under the program shall be used to
14 carry out the subprogram established under
15 subsection (k).

16 “(B) TECHNICAL AND FINANCIAL ASSIST-
17 ANCE.—Of the amounts made available under
18 subparagraph (A)—

19 “(i) 35 percent shall be used to ensure
20 the provision of tailored technical assist-
21 ance for small-scale agricultural producers
22 by—

23 “(I) hiring new Natural Re-
24 sources Conservation Service staff
25 who are familiar with the unique con-

1 servation challenges faced by small-
2 scale agricultural producers;

3 “(II) training current Natural
4 Resources Conservation Service field
5 staff regarding the challenges de-
6 scribed in subclause (I); and

7 “(III) ensuring sufficient Natural
8 Resources Conservation Service staff-
9 ing levels to deliver a streamlined and
10 expedited application and contracting
11 experience to small-scale agricultural
12 producers; and

13 “(ii) 65 percent shall be used to pro-
14 vide financial assistance directly to small-
15 scale agricultural producers.”; and

16 (3) by adding at the end the following:

17 “(k) SMALL FARM EQIP SUBPROGRAM.—

18 “(1) IN GENERAL.—In each State, the Sec-
19 retary shall establish under the program a subpro-
20 gram, under which the Secretary shall—

21 “(A) provide financial and technical assist-
22 ance to small-scale agricultural producers that
23 enter into contracts with the Secretary under
24 the subprogram;

1 “(B) conduct outreach to small-scale agri-
2 cultural producers to increase participation in
3 the subprogram; and

4 “(C) provide to field staff of the Natural
5 Resources Conservation Service training and
6 education regarding the specific conservation
7 needs of small-scale agricultural producers.

8 “(2) PAYMENTS.—

9 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
10 determine whether a small-scale agricultural
11 producer is eligible to receive payments under
12 this subsection—

13 “(i) on a State-by-State basis, subject
14 to subparagraph (C);

15 “(ii) in consultation with the technical
16 committee established under section
17 1261(a) of the State in which the small-
18 scale agricultural producer is located; and

19 “(iii) based on—

20 “(I) the operations of a small-
21 scale agricultural producer, including
22 with respect to farm size and gross
23 sales;

24 “(II) demographic data compiled
25 by the National Agricultural Statistics

1 Service relating to small-scale agricultural producers, including—
2
3 “(aa) historically under-
4 served farmers, ranchers, and
5 forest owners, including—
6 “(AA) veteran farmers
7 and ranchers;
8 “(BB) limited-resource
9 farmers, ranchers, and for-
10 est owners;
11 “(CC) beginning farm-
12 ers and ranchers; and
13 “(DD) socially dis-
14 advantaged farmers; and
15 “(bb) farmers, ranchers, and
16 forest owners operating in high-
17 poverty areas;
18 “(III) the applicable advanced
19 payment requirements under sub-
20 section (d)(4); and
21 “(IV) other relevant information,
22 as determined by the Secretary.
23 “(B) AMOUNT.—The Secretary shall pro-
24 vide payments under this subsection to a pro-
25 ducer that is eligible for the payments under

1 subparagraph (A) in such amount as the Sec-
2 retary determines—

3 “(i) achieves the purposes described in
4 subparagraphs (A) and (B) of paragraph
5 (1);

6 “(ii) addresses natural resource con-
7 cerns relating to production on small-scale
8 agricultural operations; and

9 “(iii) is in accordance with any appli-
10 cable increased payment requirements
11 under subsection (d)(4).

12 “(C) SIZE REQUIREMENTS.—

13 “(i) IN GENERAL.—To be eligible to
14 receive a payment under subparagraph (A)
15 (other than a payment described in clause
16 (ii)), the farm size of an agricultural pro-
17 ducer may not exceed the median farm size
18 of the State in which the producer is lo-
19 cated, based on aggregate data published
20 by the National Agricultural Statistics
21 Service.

22 “(ii) LIVESTOCK AND PASTURE MAN-
23 AGEMENT PAYMENTS.—To be eligible to
24 receive a livestock or pasture management
25 payment under subparagraph (A), the herd

1 size of an agricultural producer may not
2 exceed the median herd size of the State in
3 which the producer is located, based on ag-
4 gregate data published by the National Ag-
5 ricultural Statistics Service.

6 “(3) APPLICATIONS.—

7 “(A) IN GENERAL.—To be eligible to re-
8 ceive financial and technical assistance under
9 this subsection, a producer that is eligible for
10 the assistance under paragraph (2)(A) shall
11 submit to the Secretary an application at such
12 time, in such manner, and containing such in-
13 formation as the Secretary may require.

14 “(B) ADMINISTRATION.—To the maximum
15 extent practicable, the Secretary shall limit the
16 administrative burdens, and the regulatory bar-
17 riers that contribute to administrative burdens,
18 on producers applying for payments under this
19 subsection.

20 “(C) RAPID AND STREAMLINED APPLICA-
21 TION AND CONTRACT APPROVAL.—The Sec-
22 retary shall provide payments under this para-
23 graph on a continuous enrollment basis, using
24 a rapid and streamlined application and con-
25 tract approval process.

1 “(4) SUBPROGRAM COORDINATORS.—

2 “(A) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subparagraph (B), the Secretary shall designate—

3 “(i) a national subprogram coordinator; and

4 “(ii) a subprogram coordinator in each State.

5 “(B) REQUIREMENTS.—At the time of designation under subparagraph (A), a national or State subprogram coordinator shall be—

6 “(i) an employee of the Natural Resources Conservation Service; and

7 “(ii) responsible for, on a national or statewide basis, respectively—

8 “(I) public outreach relating to the subprogram;

9 “(II) assisting producers in the submission of applications under the subprogram;

10 “(III) distributing financial and technical assistance under this subsection; and

11 “(IV) submitting to the Secretary annual recommendations with respect to additional conservation practice

1 standards and activities required to
2 better serve small-scale agricultural
3 producers.

4 “(5) LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS.—The Sec-
5 retary shall publish any outreach materials for
6 small-scale agricultural producers relating to the
7 subprogram under this subsection simultaneously
8 in—

9 “(A) English; and
10 “(B) such additional languages as the Sec-
11 retary determines to be appropriate for each ap-
12 plicable State.

13 “(6) REPORT.—Not later than May 1, 2027,
14 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Ag-
15 riculture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate and
16 the Committee on Agriculture of the House of Rep-
17 resentatives a report describing the results of the
18 subprogram under this subsection, including—

19 “(A) activities carried out under paragraph
20 (3)(B) to limit administrative burdens and reg-
21 ulatory barriers; and

22 “(B) to the maximum extent practicable,
23 demographic information relating to each small-
24 scale agricultural producer participating in the

1 subprogram, as the Secretary determines to be
2 appropriate.”.
