A BILL

To amend title III of the Public Health Service Act to reauthorize certain programs with respect to lead poisoning, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Lead Poisoning Pre-
5 vention Act of 2021”.

6 **SEC. 2. SCREENINGS, REFERRALS, AND EDUCATION RE-**
7 **GARDING LEAD POISONING.**

8 Section 317A(l)(1) of the Public Health Service Act
9 (42 U.S.C. 247b–1(l)(1)) is amended by striking
10 “\$40,000,000 for fiscal year 1993, and such sums as may

1 be necessary for each of the fiscal years 1994 through
2 2005” and inserting “\$46,000,000 for each of fiscal years
3 2022 through 2026”.

4 **SEC. 3. GRANTS FOR LEAD POISONING RELATED ACTIVITIES.**
5 **TIES.**

6 Section 317O of the Public Health Service Act (42
7 U.S.C. 247b–16) is amended by striking “such sums as
8 may be necessary for each of the fiscal years 2001 through
9 2005” and inserting “\$17,000,000 for each of fiscal years
10 2022 through 2026”.

11 **SEC. 4. ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CHILDHOOD LEAD POI-**
12 **SONING PREVENTION.**

13 Section 317B(a)(2) of the Public Health Service Act
14 (42 U.S.C. 247b–3(a)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

15 “(2) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CHILDHOOD
16 LEAD POISONING PREVENTION.—

17 “(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may es-
18 tablish a council to be known as the Advisory
19 Committee on Childhood Lead Poisoning Pre-
20 vention (in this paragraph referred to as the
21 ‘Advisory Committee’).

22 “(B) COMPOSITION.—The Advisory Com-
23 mittee shall include the following members (or
24 their designee):

1 “(i) The Secretary, who shall serve as
2 the chair of the Advisory Committee.

3 “(ii) The Director of the Centers for
4 Disease Control and Prevention.

5 “(iii) The Director of the National In-
6 stitutes of Health.

7 “(iv) The Secretary of Housing and
8 Urban Development.

9 “(v) The Administrator of the Envi-
10 ronmental Protection Agency.

11 “(vi) Representatives of any other
12 Federal agency, as the Secretary deter-
13 mines appropriate.

14 “(C) DUTIES.—The Advisory Committee
15 shall—

16 “(i) coordinate the efforts of Federal
17 agencies to prevent childhood lead poi-
18 soning;

19 “(ii) review and report regularly to
20 the Congress and the public on childhood
21 lead poisoning prevention practices;

22 “(iii) recommend to the relevant Fed-
23 eral agencies improvements in national
24 childhood lead poisoning prevention efforts;
25 and

1 “(iv) develop recommendations to
2 State, local, Tribal, and territorial health
3 departments for the prevention and control
4 of childhood lead poisoning.”.

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
