A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Preserving Patients"3 Choices Act".

4 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF PATIENT-CENTERED OUTCOMES RE5 SEARCH AND RESCISSION OF UNOBLIGATED 6 FUNDS RELATED TO SUCH RESEARCH.

7 (a) REPEAL.—Section 6301 of the Patient Protection
8 and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–148), as
9 amended by section 10602 of such Act, is repealed and
10 the provisions of law amended or repealed by such section
11 6301 are restored or revived as if such section had not
12 been enacted.

(b) RESCISSION.—Of the funds made available by
section 9511 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
added by section 6301(e) of the Patient Protection and
Affordable Care Act, or by section 1181(b)(3) of the Social
Security Act, as added by section 6301(a) of the Patient
Protection and Affordable Care Act, the unobligated balance is rescinded.

20 SEC. 3. REPEAL OF CERTAIN ARRA PROVISIONS AND RE21 SCISSION OF UNOBLIGATED FUNDS RELATED
22 TO SUCH PROVISIONS.

(a) REPEAL.—Each of subtitles A through C of title
XIII of division A of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public Law 111-5) are repealed and
the provisions of law amended or repealed by such subHR 556 IH

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titles are restored or revived as if such subtitles had not
 been enacted.

3 (b) RESCISSIONS.—There are hereby rescinded all 4 unobligated balances remaining available as of the date 5 of the enactment of this Act of funds made available by division A of the American Recovery and Reinvestment 6 7 Act of 2009 (Public Law 111–5) under the headings 8 "Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality" under title XVIII of such division and "Office of the National Coordi-9 10 nator for Health Information Technology" under such 11 title.

12 SEC. 4. USE OF FUNDS TO REDUCE NATIONAL DEBT.

13 The total amount rescinded by this Act shall be de-14 posited in the Federal Treasury to pay down the national15 debt.

16 SEC. 5. BUDGETARY EFFECTS.

17 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of 18 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010, 19 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement 20 titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation" for this 21 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record 22 by the Chairman of the House Budget Committee, pro-23 vided that such statement has been submitted prior to the 24 vote on passage.

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
