#### AN ACT

- To require the TSA to develop a plan to ensure that TSA material disseminated in major airports can be better understood by more people accessing such airports, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "TSA Reaching Across				
3	Nationalities, Societies, and Languages to Advance Trav-				
4	eler Education Act" or the "TRANSLATE Act".				
5	SEC. 2. PLAN.				
6	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the				
7	date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of				
8	the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) shall				
9	submit to the Committee on Homeland Security of the				
10	House of Representatives and the Committee on Com-				
11	merce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a plan				
12	to ensure that TSA material disseminated in major air-				
13	ports can be better understood by more people accessing				
14	such airports.				
15	(b) CONTENTS.—The plan required under subsection				
16	(a) shall include the following:				
17	(1) An identification of the most common lan-				
18	guages other than English that are the primary lan-				
19	guages of individuals that travel through or work in				
20	each major airport.				
21	(2) A plan to improve—				
22	(A) TSA materials to communicate infor-				
23	mation in languages identified pursuant to				
24	paragraph (1); and				
25	(B) the communication of TSA material to				
26	individuals with vision or hearing impairments

- 2 material.
- 3 (c) Considerations.—In developing the plan re-
- 4 quired under subsection (a), the Administrator of the
- 5 TSA, acting through the Office of Civil Rights and Lib-
- 6 erties, Ombudsman, and Traveler Engagement of the
- 7 TSA, shall take into consideration data regarding the fol-
- 8 lowing:
- 9 (1) International enplanement.
- 10 (2) Local populations surrounding major air-
- ports.
- 12 (d) Implementation.—Not later than 180 days
- 13 after the submission of the plan required under subsection
- 14 (a), the Administrator of the TSA shall implement such
- 15 plan.
- 16 (e) GAO REVIEW.—Not later than one year after the
- 17 implementation pursuant to subsection (d) of the plan re-
- 18 quired under subsection (a), the Comptroller General of
- 19 the United States shall submit to the Committee on
- 20 Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and
- 21 the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation
- 22 of the Senate a review of such implementation.
- 23 (f) Definitions.—In this section:

1	(1) AIRPORT.—The term "airport" has the
2	meaning given such term in section 40102 of title
3	49, United States Code.

- (2) Major airports.—The term "major airports" means Category X and Category I airports.
- (3) Non-traveling individual" has the meaning given such term in section 1560.3 of title 49, Code of Federal Regulations.
- 10 (4) TSA MATERIAL.—The term "TSA mate11 rial" means signs, videos, audio messages, websites,
  12 press releases, social media postings, and other com13 munications published and disseminated by the Ad14 ministrator of the TSA in Category X and Category
  15 I airports for use by both traveling and non-trav16 eling individuals.
