1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Rural Representation 2 3 and Transparency Improvement Act". 4 SEC. 2. ENSURING PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION OF 5 INTERESTS OF RURAL AREAS ON THE MEDI-6 PAYMENT ADVISORY **COMMISSION** CARE 7 (MEDPAC) AND GREATER TRANSPARENCY OF 8 **MEDPAC PROCEEDINGS.** 9 (a) RURAL REPRESENTATION.—Paragraph (2) of section 1805(c) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 10 1395b-6(c)) is amended— 11 (1) in subparagraph (A), by inserting "con-12 sistent with subparagraph (E)" after "rural rep-13 14 resentatives"; and 15 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-16 paragraph: "(E) PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION OF 17 18 INTERESTS OF RURAL AREAS.—In order to pro-19 vide a balance between urban and rural rep-20 resentatives under subparagraph (A), the pro-21 portion of members of the Commission who rep-22 resent the interests of health care providers and 23 Medicare beneficiaries located in rural areas 24 shall be no less than the proportion of the total 25 number of Medicare beneficiaries who reside in 26 rural areas.".

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(b) GREATER TRANSPARENCY OF PROCEEDINGS.—
Such section is further amended by adding at the end the
following new paragraph:

((7))4 GREATER TRANSPARENCY OF PRO-5 CEEDINGS.—The Commission shall provide through the Internet or such easy public access to and full 6 7 and timely public disclosure of its proceedings, such as through the posting of audio or video coverage of 8 9 its proceedings and of transcripts of its proceedings, 10 as may be practicable within the resources available 11 to the Commission.".

12 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by 13 subsection (a) shall apply to appointments to the Medicare 14 Payment Advisory Commission made after the date of en-15 actment of this Act and the amendment made by sub-16 section (b) shall apply to proceedings occurring on or after 17 the date that is 6 months after the date of the enactment 18 of this Act.
