Mr. GRAYSON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Education to assess the impact of school start times on student health, well-being, and performance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Assessing Appropriate
5 School Start Times Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. ADDITION OF STUDY ON SCHOOL START TIMES TO**
7 **“STUDIES OF NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE”.**

8 Section 5414 (20 U.S.C. 7243c) of the Elementary
9 and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6301

1 et seq.) is amended in subsection (a) by adding at the end
2 the following:

3 “(4) APPROPRIATE SCHOOL START TIMES.—A
4 study assessing the impact of school start times on
5 student health, well-being, and performance.”.

6 **SEC. 3. COMPLETION DATE.**

7 The study required by section 2 shall be completed
8 not later than 18 months after the date of enactment of
9 this Act.

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
