Mr. GREEN of Tennessee (for himself and Mr. THOMPSON of Mississippi) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Accountability

A BILL

To extend the authority to provide employees of the United States Secret Service with overtime pay beyond other statutory limitations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Overtime Pay for Pro-
5 tective Services Act of 2023”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF OVERTIME PAY EXCEPTION**
2 **THROUGH 2028 FOR PROTECTIVE SERVICES.**

3 (a) AMENDMENTS.—Section 2 of the Overtime Pay
4 for Protective Services Act of 2016 (5 U.S.C. 5547 note)
5 is amended—

6 (1) in the section heading, by striking “**2023**”
7 and inserting “**2028**”;

8 (2) in subsection (a)—

9 (A) in the heading, by striking “DEFINI-
10 TION” and inserting “DEFINITIONS”;

11 (B) by striking “In this section, the term”
12 and inserting the following: “In this section—
13 “(1) the term”; and

14 (C) by striking “2023.” and inserting the
15 following: “2028; and

16 “(2) the term ‘protective services’ does not in-
17 clude routine administrative or technical work that
18 supports the daily operations of the United States
19 Secret Service.”; and

20 (3) in subsection (b)(1), by striking “during
21 each of calendar years 2016 through 2023” and in-
22 serting “for protective services during each of cal-
23 endar years 2016 through 2028”.

24 (b) REPORTS.—

25 (1) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

1 (A) APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF CON-
2 GRESS.—The term “appropriate committees of
3 Congress” means—

4 (i) the Committee on Appropriations
5 of the Senate;

6 (ii) the Committee on Homeland Se-
7 curity and Governmental Affairs of the
8 Senate;

9 (iii) the Committee on the Judiciary
10 of the Senate;

11 (iv) the Committee on Appropriations
12 of the House of Representatives;

13 (v) the Committee on Homeland Secu-
14 rity of the House of Representatives;

15 (vi) the Committee on Oversight and
16 Accountability of the House of Representa-
17 tives; and

18 (vii) the Committee on the Judiciary
19 of the House of Representatives.

20 (B) DIRECTOR.—The term “Director”
21 means the Director of the United States Secret
22 Service.

23 (2) ANNUAL PROJECTIONS.—

24 (A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than Decem-
25 ber 31 of each of calendar years 2023 through

1 2027, the Director shall submit to the appro-
2 priate committees of Congress a report that
3 contains, with respect to the calendar year fol-
4 lowing the calendar year in which the report is
5 submitted, projections for the information de-
6 scribed in paragraphs (1) through (7) of section
7 2(e) of the Secret Service Recruitment and Re-
8 tention Act of 2018 (Public Law 115–160; 132
9 Stat. 1246), which shall be divided by calendar
10 quarter.

11 (B) QUARTERLY UPDATES.—With respect
12 to each annual report required under subpara-
13 graph (A), the Director shall, on the last day
14 of each calendar quarter of the calendar year
15 that is covered by the report, submit to the ap-
16 propriate committees of Congress an updated
17 version of that report that contains projections
18 for the information described in that subpara-
19 graph for the remainder of that calendar year,
20 which shall be divided by calendar quarter.

21 (C) DEEMING OF PERIOD.—Solely for the
22 purposes of a report required under this para-
23 graph, a reference in any of paragraphs (1)
24 through (7) of section 2(e) of the Secret Service
25 Recruitment and Retention Act of 2018 (Public

1 Law 115–160; 132 Stat. 1246) to a numerical
2 value for a previous calendar year shall be
3 deemed to be a projection of that numerical
4 value for an upcoming calendar year or for the
5 remainder of a calendar year, as applicable.

6 (3) EFFECT OF AMENDMENTS.—Not later than
7 January 30 of each of calendar years 2024 through
8 2029, the Director shall submit to the appropriate
9 committees of Congress a report on the effects of
10 the amendments made by subsection (a), which shall
11 include, with respect to the previous calendar year,
12 the following:

13 (A) The information described in para-
14 graphs (1) through (7) of section 2(c) of the
15 Secret Service Recruitment and Retention Act
16 of 2018 (Public Law 115–160; 132 Stat.
17 1246).

18 (B) A comparison between the final data
19 reported under subparagraph (A) and the an-
20 nual projections reported for that calendar year
21 under paragraph (2)(A), including an expla-
22 nation for any substantial variance between
23 that final data and those annual projections.

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
