Mr. BARTON (for himself and Mr. BRIDENSTINE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To adapt to changing crude oil market conditions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

4 The Congress finds that—

5 (1) the United States has enjoyed a renaissance
6 in energy production, establishing the United States
7 as the world's leading oil producer;

8 (2) the United States upholds a commitment to
9 free trade and open markets and has consistently

1 opposed attempts by other nations to restrict the
2 free flow of energy; and

3 (3) the United States should remove all restric-
4 tions on the export of crude oil, which will provide
5 domestic economic benefits, enhanced energy secu-
6 rity, and flexibility in foreign diplomacy.

7 **SEC. 2. REPEAL.**

8 Section 103 of the Energy Policy and Conservation
9 Act (42 U.S.C. 6212) and the item relating thereto in the
10 table of contents of that Act are repealed.

11 **SEC. 3. NATIONAL POLICY ON OIL EXPORT RESTRICTION.**

12 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, to pro-
13 mote the efficient exploration, production, storage, supply,
14 marketing, pricing, and regulation of energy resources, in-
15 cluding fossil fuels, no official of the Federal Government
16 shall impose or enforce any restriction on the export of
17 crude oil.

18 **SEC. 4. STUDY AND RECOMMENDATIONS.**

19 Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment
20 of this Act, the Secretary of Energy shall conduct a study
21 and transmit to the Committee on Energy and Commerce
22 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
23 Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate rec-

- 1 ommendations on the appropriate size, composition, and
- 2 purpose of the Strategic Petroleum Reserve.

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
