A BILL

To amend the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 to reduce hunger, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Economic Recovery5 Through Increased Feeding Act of 2009".

6 SEC. 2. FINGERPRINTING PROHIBITED.

7 Section 11(e)(2)(D) of the Food and Nutrition Act
8 of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2020(e)(2)(D)) is amended by inserting
9 the following before the semicolon at the end: ", and the
10 fingerprint or any other form of biometic testing of any

SEC. 4. PARTICIPATION IN SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION AS-14 15 SISTANCE PROGRAM IN CITIES. 16 (a) REPORTS.—The Secretary of Agriculture shall— 17 (1) require the appropriate States to submit to 18 the Secretary reports identifying the levels of partici-19 pation in the supplemental nutrition assistance pro-20 gram by eligible households located in the 25 largest 21 cities in the United States, and 22 (2) submit to the Congress a report identifying 23 the results contained in the reports required by 24 paragraph (1). 25 (b) ACTIVITIES TO INCREASE PARTICIPATION.—

1	(1) REQUIREMENT.—If a State submits a re-
2	port under subsection $(a)(1)$ that identifies a city in
3	which the participation rate of eligible households in
4	the supplemental nutrition assistance program is
5	less than 85 percent, the Secretary of Agriculture
6	shall require such State to implement practices to
7	increase such participation rate.
8	(2) DEFINITION.—The term "practices" means
9	telephone interviews, educational public service an-
10	nouncements, town halls, and other services that the
11	State deems fit to increase the participation rate to
12	more than 85 percent of eligible households.
13	SEC. 5. GRANTS TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO BENEFITS.
14	Section 11(t) of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008
15	(7 U.S.C. 2020(t)) is amended—
16	(1) in paragraph (1) by striking "\$5,000,000"
17	and inserting "\$15,000,000", and
18	(2) in paragraph (5) —
19	(A) in subparagraph (A) by striking "and"
20	at the end,
21	(B) in subparagraph (B) by striking the
22	period at the end and inserting "and", and
23	(C) by adding at the end the following:
24	"(C) shall give special consideration to eli-
25	gible entities that are nonprofit organizations

that provide on site at the locations of such or ganizations online application support to eligible
 households.".

4 SEC. 6. ENCOURAGE BETTER NUTRITION.

5 (a) EBT CARD ACCESS AT FARMERS' MARKETS.— 6 The Secretary of Agriculture shall carry out a program to support the use of electronic benefits transfers for Fed-7 8 eral nutrition programs at farmers' markets by means of 9 installing or modernizing electronic benefit transfer equip-10 ment at such markets and by providing educational forums on the benefits of nutrition program participation 11 at such markets. 12

13 (b) LIMITATIONS.—Funds available to carry out this14 section—

(1) may not be used for the ongoing cost of car-rying out any project, and

(2) shall only be provided to eligible entities
that demonstrate a plan to continue to provide electronic benefit transfer card access at 1 or more
farmers' markets following the receipt of such funds.
(c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
authorized to be appropriated \$25,000,000 to carry out
this section.

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
