## A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit the Governor of a State to reject the resettlement of a refugee in that State unless there is adequate assurance that the alien does not present a security risk, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “State Refugee Security  
5 Act of 2017”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORITY OF STATES TO REJECT RESETTLEMENT**  
2 **OF REFUGEES.**

3 Section 207 of the Immigration and Nationality Act  
4 (8 U.S.C. 1157) is amended by adding at the end the fol-  
5 lowing:

6 “(g) NOTICE OF REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT.—The  
7 Office of Refugee Resettlement shall notify the State agen-  
8 cy responsible for coordinating the placement or resettle-  
9 ment of an alien eligible to be admitted to the United  
10 States under this section not later than 21 days before  
11 the arrival of such alien in the State.

12 “(h) STATE REJECTION OF REFUGEE RESETTLE-  
13 MENT.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no  
14 alien eligible to be admitted to the United States under  
15 this section shall be placed or resettled in a State if the  
16 Governor of that State certifies to the Director of the Of-  
17 fice of Refugee Resettlement that the Director has failed,  
18 in the sole determination of the Governor, to provide ade-  
19 quate assurance that the alien does not present a security  
20 risk to the State.”.
