## A BILL

To prohibit States or local governments from prohibiting the connection, reconnection, modification, installation, or expansion of an energy service based on the type or source of energy to be delivered, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Energy Choice Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. LIMITATIONS ON REGULATION OF ENERGY CHOICE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—No State or local government, or  
3 instrumentality or regulatory agency thereof, may adopt  
4 a law, ordinance, building code, or efficiency standard that  
5 prohibits, or has the effect of prohibiting, the connection,  
6 reconnection, modification, installation, or expansion of an  
7 energy service based on the type or source of energy to  
8 be delivered to an end-user of such energy service.

9 (b) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term “energy”  
10 includes—

- 11 (1) natural gas;
- 12 (2) renewable gas;
- 13 (3) hydrogen;
- 14 (4) liquified petroleum gas;
- 15 (5) renewable liquified petroleum gas;
- 16 (6) other liquid petroleum products;
- 17 (7) biomass-based diesel fuels;
- 18 (8) other liquid petroleum products and renew-  
19 able fuels; and
- 20 (9) electricity.
