## A BILL

To repeal the Military Selective Service Act, including the registration requirements of the Military Selective Service Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Military Selective Serv-  
5 ice Repeal Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF MILITARY SELECTIVE SERVICE ACT.**

7 (a) REPEAL.—The Military Selective Service Act (50  
8 U.S.C. 3801 et seq.) is repealed.

9 (b) TRANSFERS IN CONNECTION WITH REPEAL.—

10 Notwithstanding the proviso in section 10(a)(4) of the

1 Military Selective Service Act (50 U.S.C. 3809(a)(4)), the  
2 Office of Selective Service Records shall not be reestab-  
3 lished upon the repeal of the Act. Not later than 180 days  
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the assets,  
5 contracts, property, and records held by the Selective  
6 Service System, and the unexpended balances of any ap-  
7 propriations available to the Selective Service System,  
8 shall be transferred to the Administrator of General Serv-  
9 ices upon the repeal of the Act. The Director of the Office  
10 of Personnel Management shall assist officers and employ-  
11 ees of the Selective Service System to transfer to other  
12 positions in the executive branch.

13 (c) EFFECT ON EXISTING SANCTIONS.—Notwith-  
14 standing any other provision of law, a person may not be  
15 denied a right, privilege, benefit, or employment position  
16 under Federal law on the grounds that the person, before  
17 the repeal of the Military Selective Service Act (50 U.S.C.  
18 3801 et seq.) by subsection (a), failed to present himself  
19 for and submit to registration under section 3 of such Act  
20 (50 U.S.C. 3802).
