# **A BILL**

To require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to designate a point of contact for for-profit child care providers, submit a report to Congress, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        *This Act may be cited as the “Child Care Small Busi-*  
5 *ness Insight and Improvement Act of 2023”.*

6 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON FOR-PROFIT CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.**

7        *(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the*  
8 *date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the*  
9 *Small Business Administration shall submit to Congress a*  
10 *study and report on for-profit child care providers that in-*  
11 *cludes—*

12            *(1) an assessment of the challenges and needs of*  
13 *such providers;*

14            *(2) a description of the resources and support*  
15 *that the Small Business Administration provides to*  
16 *such providers;*

17            *(3) any deficiencies in the resources and support*  
18 *described under paragraph (2);*

19            *(4) any recommendations for legislative actions*  
20 *necessary to address any challenges or needs faced by*  
21 *such providers that are identified by the report re-*  
22 *quired in this subsection; and*

23            *(5) an identification of the leadership needs in*  
24 *order to successfully implement such recommenda-*  
25 *tions.*

1           **(b) FOR-PROFIT CHILD CARE PROVIDER DEFINED.**—

2   *The term “for-profit child care provider” has the meaning*  
3   *given the term “eligible child care provider” in section 658P*  
4   *of the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 1990*  
5   *(42 U.S.C. 9858n) and is a provider that operates—*

6           (1) *on a for-profit basis; and*

7           (2) *in one or more of the several States, territory*  
8   *or possession of the United States, or the District of*  
9   *Columbia.*

10          **(c) COMPLIANCE WITH CUTGO.**—*No additional*  
11 *amounts are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this*  
12 *Act.*



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
